

# Bobbies make arrests

LONDON — Police arrested seven terror suspects early today after raiding a north London mosque in an operation linked to the recent discovery of the deadly poison ricin, police said.

Witnesses said about 150 police officers, some armed while others carried ladders and battering rams, took part in the raid on the North London Central Mosque and two neighboring houses. Two helicopters shone spotlights on the mosque and houses.

Seven people were arrested under the Terrorism Act 2000 and taken to a London police station, a spokesman for the Metropolitan Police said on condition of anonymity.

“The operation is part of ongoing and extensive inquiries by the Metropolitan Police’s Anti-Terrorist Branch into alleged terrorist activity in London and elsewhere in the U.K.,” he said.

CARACAS, Venezuela — Calling his adversaries “terrorists,” President Hugo Chavez has warned the government could walk out of negotiations with leaders of the seven-week general strike intended to force him from office.

In his weekly television call-in show Sunday, Chavez accused strike leaders of “generating chaos, denying the country water and food” as a way to provoke a coup.

“We are carefully evaluating the possibility that our representatives will leave the (negotiating) table,” Chavez said. “We don’t talk with terrorists.”

Negotiations sponsored by the Organization of American States began in November but have failed to resolve the situation. Six countries — Brazil, Chile, Mexico, Portugal, Spain and the United States — have begun an initiative called “Friends of Venezuela” to help the talks. Chavez and the opposition have both welcomed the “Friends” initiative.

A combination of political parties, business leaders and labor unions called the strike on Dec. 2 to pressure Chavez to resign or call early elections if he loses a Feb. 2 referendum on his rule.

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. — In a week of testimony, the hearing into last year’s deadly bombing of Canadian troops in Afghanistan centered on one issue: whether the U.S. pilots reasonably believed they were under attack.

Lawyers for Maj. Harry Schmidt and William Umbach have said the airmen were not told that allies would be conducting live-ammunition exercises near Kandahar on April 17.

When Schmidt saw flashes of gunfire on the ground, he was justified in bombing because he thought al-Qaida or Taliban troops were firing on Umbach, they said.

The Air Force charged Schmidt and Umbach with involuntary manslaughter, saying Schmidt and Umbach, the mission’s commander, should have evaded the fire until it was clear that it came from enemy forces.

Four Canadian soldiers were killed. Eight were wounded.

The hearing was scheduled to resume today. It had been expected to run through Friday, but David Beck, Umbach’s lawyer, said Sunday that

it would likely end two days early because the Air Force had scratched several planned witnesses.

More than a dozen witnesses have testified in the hearing, which will determine whether the case should go to a court martial.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — Space shuttle Columbia’s astronauts ignited flames inside their orbiting laboratory so scientists back home could learn more about soot.

The flames were contained in a chamber inside an even bigger chamber, and there was no danger of fire breaking out.

Astronauts Kalpana Chawla, an American who was born in India, and Ilan Ramon, the first Israeli in space, used a hot wire igniter and jet burner Sunday to produce flames up to 2 inches long. They collected some of the soot for analysis back on Earth.

Scientists want to better understand the production of soot, a pollutant that can lead to lung disease. They turned to space in order to eliminate the rising of hot air — the so-called buoyancy effect — and to slow the reactions inside flames for easier study.

In other work Sunday — the third day of the 16-day, round-the-clock research mission — the astronauts took more camera images of the Mediterranean and Atlantic in hopes of observing dust plumes and donated more blood in the name of science.

NEW YORK — The Bush administration is drawing support from China and France for its view that North Korea’s acceleration of a nuclear weapons program poses an international problem.

And even while trying to engage North Korea in direct talks, the administration wants to bring the issue to the U.N. Security Council, a senior U.S. official said late Sunday.

Secretary of State Colin Powell met in New York with Foreign Ministers Tang Jiaxuan of China and Dominique de Villepin of France, and they agreed that North Korea’s resumption of a nuclear weapons program is a world concern, State Department spokesman Richard Boucher said.

Powell in his talks with foreign ministers who also are attending a U.N. conference on terrorism, found “recognition by all that Korea’s nuclearization has caused an international problem, and they discussed how the international community can respond,” Boucher said.

North Korea’s decision to pull out of the 1968 treaty to curb the spread of nuclear technology is prompting the United States to take the issue to the Security Council, said a senior U.S. official, speaking on condition of anonymity.

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. — Two films filled with strong female roles triumphed at the Golden Globe Awards as the jazz-belted lobe prisoners of “Chicago” won best musical-comedy and “The Hours” claimed best drama for its tale of women seeking solace in the work of suicidal author Virginia Woolf.

“I say to the writers, please keep

writing for us, we’re very interesting,” Nicole Kidman said after winning best dramatic actress for her role as Woolf. “And to the directors, please keep taking chances and giving us complicated, rich characters to play.”

Kidman’s award Sunday night marked her second consecutive Golden Globe.

“Chicago” star Renee Zellweger won best musical-comedy actress for her role as murderer and wannabe cabaret singer Roxy Hart.

The TV category for best drama and comedy marked an upset by edgy cable shows.

“The Shield” won best TV drama, upsetting such major shows as “The Sopranos” and “The West Wing,” and its star, Michael Chiklis, was named best actor in a drama series.

HBO’s acerbic sitcom “Curb Your Enthusiasm” won best TV comedy series over “Sex and the City,” “Friends” “The Simpsons” and “Will & Grace.”

WASHINGTON — President Bush marks the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday with a visit to a predominantly black church to meet with congregation members at a time when his decisions on affirmative action and judicial nominations have brought criticism.

To coincide with the holiday, the White House announced Sunday the president will propose increasing spending by 5 percent for grants to historically black colleges, universities, graduate programs and Hispanic education institutions.

Bush was headed today to the First Baptist Church of Glenarden in Landover, Md., just outside Washington. He was meeting privately with members and also attending a memorial service for King, the civil rights leader assassinated in 1968.

WASHINGTON — Sitting on a frigid street in view of the White House and surrounded by chanting anti-war demonstrators, Sister Carole Bialock ate a cookie and smiled.

“It is a privilege to protest,” she said. The 73-year-old Roman Catholic nun from Houston was in Washington for the weekend of demonstrations against a possible war with Iraq.

“Anger has brought me here and sadness that our government has sunk so low and is becoming an empire that is really devastating the world,” she said. “I strongly believe in nonviolent protest in the spirit of Gandhi and Martin Luther King.”

Many of the approximately 1,000 protesters who rallied Sunday near the White House invoked King’s legacy on a weekend of remembrance for the slain civil rights leader.

The demonstration capped a weekend that featured a huge and peaceful rally Saturday and protests around the country and the world.

Condoleezza Rice, Bush’s national security adviser, welcomed the protests as an expression of American freedoms.

“It contrasts so greatly with the situation that people in Iraq find themselves in, where your tongue can be ripped out for criticizing the regime,” she said on NBC’s “Meet the Press.”

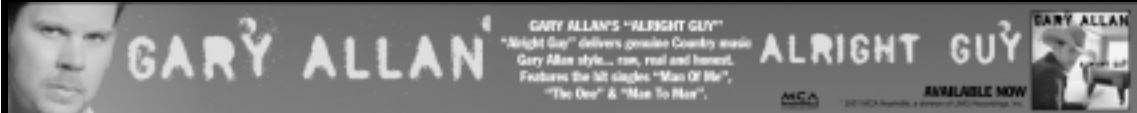

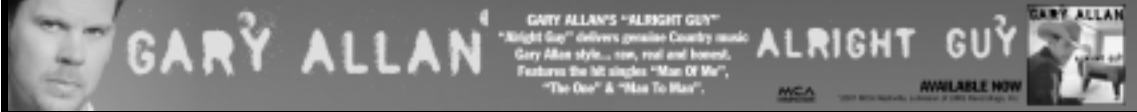
