

Brewster Bulldogs lose to Liberty League champs

The Brewster High School girls and boys basketball teams both took a loss on Tuesday night to the Tribune Jackrabbits. The girls lost by only 5 points, 59-54, while the boys lost 73-58.
In the girls game, both teams were closely matched and ended the half at 27-27. In the first quarter Brewster scored 12 while Tribune scored 13. In the second quarter Brewster outscored the Jackrabbits 15-14.
After the break Tribune was charged and able to once again outscore the Bulldogs. Brewster was only able to sink 9 points while Tribune had 15.

The Lady Bulldogs were now down six points heading into the final quarter of play. Tribune would not let Brewster take the advantage, although Brewster scored 18 to Tribune's 17, it was not enough to take a win over the Lady Jackrabbits who took first place in the Western Kansas Liberty League tournament over the weekend.
Alicia Collett led the way for the ladies in scoring, tallying 22. She was followed by Sara Luckert 10; Jalyn Reid 9; Andrea Horney 7; Amy Carpenter 4 and Caitlan Rush 2.
Tribune's boys, who also place first in the league tournament last weekend, took and early lead on Brewster in the first quarter, 24-18.

In the second quarter it was much of the same as the Jackrabbits once again dominated, 20-12. By half-time their lead was stretched to 14 points over the Bulldogs.
The Bulldogs regrouped during the break and were able to come back to overpower Tribune in the third quarter. For the only quarter of play, Brewster outscored Tribune, 20-15, but the extra 5 points were not nearly enough to make up for the 14 points they were behind in the first half.
In the final quarter the Jackrabbits once again gained momentum and scored 14 to Brewster's 8 to win the game 73-58.
Jace Terry was the top scorer for the Bulldogs with 19. Other points were made by Jacob Falcon 15; Paul Flanders 10; Heath Baird 9; Sean Swanson and Jarrett Carpenter 2; and Josh Ryan 1.

Rebounds were credited to Murray 14; Bedore 6; Archer 5; Sheldon, Studer, Clancy and McCall 2; and Billinger and Amber Cowan 1 each. Lindsey Schields led the team in assists with 4. Billinger had 3; Studer, Clancy and Bedore had 2; and Archer, Sheldon, Murray and Cowan all had 1. Steals were recorded by Billinger and Bedore 5; Sheldon and Cowan 4; Clancy 2; and Schields, Archer, Studer, Murray and McCall 1.
In a 5th quarter for the game, Oberlin and Goodland both scored 2 points. Sandy Johnson was the scorer for the Mustangs. Everyone was credited with rebounds. Johnson, Kerri Bellamy and Nicole David pulled down 4, while Crystal Hernandez had 2 and Amber Webster and Whitney Dautel each had one. Steals were recorded for Johnson and Bellamy.
