Telling the difference between abuse and addiction is hard. Addiction begins as abuse, or usage, of a substance like marijuana or cocaine. A person can abuse a drug without having an addiction.

For example, if a person smoked marijuana a few times, that doesn't mean he or she has an addiction, but it does mean that person is abusing a drug, and that could lead to an ad-

Addiction means having no control over whether to use a drug. A person who is addicted to a drug has grown so used to the drug that he has to have it. Addiction can be physical, psychological or both.

Physical addiction is when a person's body actually becomes dependent on a drug. It also means that a person builds tolerance to a drug, which means he needs a larger dose of that drug to get the same effects.

When a person who is physically addicted stops using drugs, he may experience withdrawal symptoms. Withdrawal can be like having the flu; common symptoms are diarrhea, shaking and generally feeling


