

# Bush rejects policy

misusing intelligence sources or methods. The task is complicated by the fact that a photograph that is meaningful to intelligence officers may appear to an untrained observer as simply a bunch of rooftops, a senior official said.

Rumsfeld and Powell discussed with lawmakers the possibility of Saddam going into exile, said House Majority Leader Tom DeLay, R-Texas.

DeLay said that "if it's done under the right conditions, I would say they see that as an option. There are still possibilities out there to avoid going to war."

On a new U.N. resolution, the administration takes the position that one is not necessary to use force against Iraq in light of the warning of serious consequences for failure to disarm in an earlier resolution.

But if a fresh resolution would help other governments make the case to their public for using force the Bush administration would consider it, this official said.

Fleischer declined to elaborate on what evidence will be furnished, although he did say Powell would "connect the dots."

He argued that the case essentially has been made, saying Bush already sees "a Mount Everest of information. Making Mount Everest is not necessary."

U.N. inspectors reported this week that Iraq hasn't provided evidence it dismantled chemical and biological weapons programs and has failed to fully cooperate in the inspection process. The administration says that bolsters its case that Iraq is not living up to its obligations under U.N. resolutions. But some U.S. allies say that isn't enough to justify war and the United States should provide evidence that Iraq still possesses banned weapons.

The administration has been reluctant to do so, saying that could force the disclosure of intelligence sources and methods. But it is hearing from all sides that it has not clinched the case.

Meanwhile, the Coast Guard said it is sending eight cutters and some

600 people into the Gulf region. And the Pentagon announced that another 15,718 National Guard and Reserve forces have been called to active duty over the past week.

In his State of the Union speech Tuesday night, Bush indirectly acknowledged that he faces a variety of doubters.

"Some have said we must not act until the threat is imminent," Bush said. "Trusting in the sanity and restraint of Saddam Hussein is not a strategy, and it is not an option."

Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., said Bush hadn't made a persuasive case that the threat is imminent and that war is the only alternative. As a result, Kennedy said, he would introduce a resolution requiring Bush to present "convincing evidence of an imminent threat" before sending troops to fight Iraq.

Assailing Kennedy's plan was Senate Armed Services Committee Chairman John Warner, R-Va., who said Congress should instead "stay in step with the president" to strengthen his hand in seeking a diplomatic resolution.

# Sharon calls for unity

around the world

JERUSALEM — Bolstered by a resounding election victory, Prime Minister Ariel Sharon today called for national unity against "the murderous hatred" of Palestinian militants, but his efforts to form a broad coalition government are likely to be thwarted by the defeated Labor party.

Sharon might be forced into an alliance with ultranationalist parties that want to block U.S.-backed peace moves and spur him to even tougher moves against the Palestinians. Israel TV quoted Sharon as saying off-camera that he'd rather call new elections than preside over such a coalition.

Sharon's Likud doubled its strength, from 19 to 37 seats in the 120-member parliament. Likud's political rival, the center-left Labor, posted its worst-ever showing, dropping from 26 to 19 seats.

Sharon profited from the Israeli electorate's shift to the right in re-

sponse to 28 months of fighting with the Palestinians. Many Israelis are angry at the Palestinians, believing they lied about wanting peace and responded to a reasonable offer with violence. Voters blamed Labor, which led the failed peace negotiations, for the nation's troubles.

BAGRAM, Afghanistan — American forces were carefully combing through a vast cave network on a steep mountain slope today after the fiercest battle in Afghanistan in nearly a year, the U.S. military said. Two men detained in the fighting were being questioned.

The fighting had died down by this morning, but the flare-up has served as a stark reminder that the war in Afghanistan is not over, even as the possibility of a new conflict looms in Iraq.

Hundreds of U.S. and coalition

ground forces were in the area today, and an array of sophisticated air weaponry was called in to pummel the mountainside with earth-shattering bombs. There were no reports of coalition casualties.

U.S. and coalition troops had their hands full today searching through scores of caves in the southeastern mountain area, said Col. Roger King, a spokesman for the U.S. military at Bagram Air Base.

King said soldiers had gone through 30 caves so far. They have detained two enemy fighters and found 107mm rockets and other weapons.

The military had estimated that about 80 fighters were holed up but today said the figure could be significantly lower. The earlier number was based on interrogation of a man detained after a firefight near the southeastern town of Spinboldak.

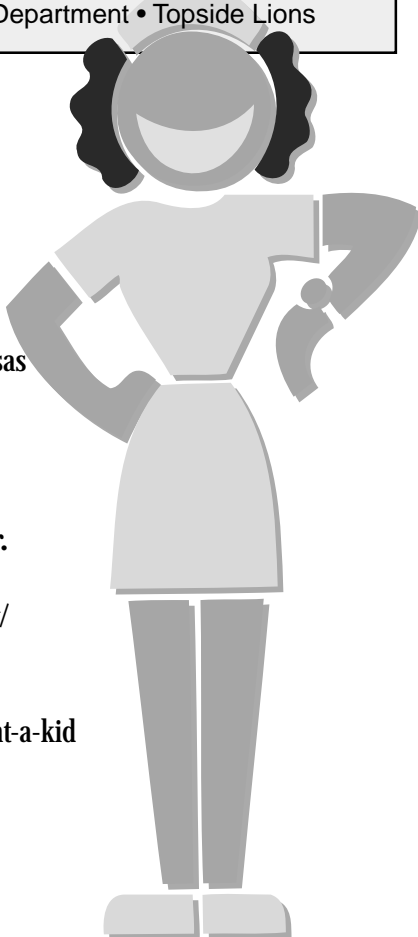

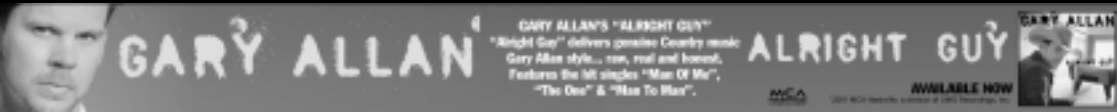
