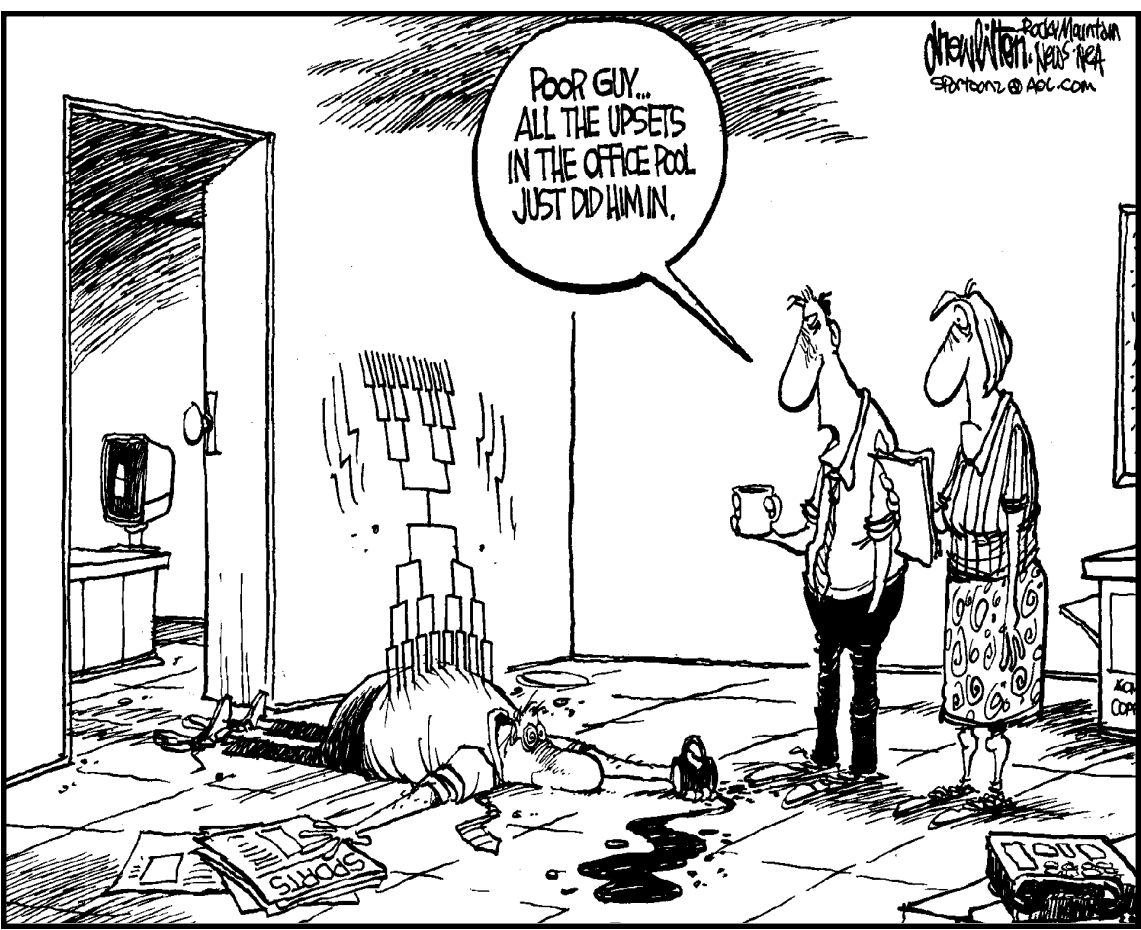

The Sharon Springs Lady Wildcats had little time to think about their overtime loss to Weskan on Tuesday because they had to prepare themselves for Friday's game against the Tribune Jackrabbits.

None of the Wildcats scored in double digits as seniors Darci Siebert and Renee Rains scored eight points each; Ashley Bruce hit two 3-pointers for six points; and Brandi Bertrand and Lexie Bellamy had two points each.

Jentri Dixon led the Jackrabbits and all scorers with 17 points while Shawna Petersen added 16.

Nuggets lose to Trail Blazers, 98-92

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — When the NBA suspended Rasheed Wallace, most people thought the Portland Trail Blazers would make a move in the standings — down.

But having played without their leading scorer and rebounder for six games of his seven-game suspension for threatening a referee on Jan. 15, the Blazers have improved from five to 2 1/2 games behind Pacific Division-leading Sacramento.

“Our course is just to continue playing good basketball,” Blazers coach Maurice Cheeks said. “Right now we’re just trying to

stay with our rhythm and let it take us where it may.”

Aryvdas Sabonis scored 10 second-half points and provided tough interior defense while Scottie Pippen had a late key defensive stop Tuesday night as the Blazers beat the Denver Nuggets 98-92.

The Blazers insist it's too early to talk about taking over first place from Sacramento, which lost at home to Utah.

Juwan Howard had 17 points and six rebounds to lead the Nuggets, who lost their fifth in a row overall and seventh straight on the road.

Avalance tie Blue Jackets to end winning streak

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—For a change, the Columbus Blue Jackets did not lose to Patrick Roy and the Colorado Avalanche.

Lasse Pirjeta and Grant Marshall scored goals 17 seconds apart in the second period as the Blue Jackets forged a 2-2 tie Tuesday night for their first point ever against the Avs.

The Avalanche won each of the previous 10 meetings, the longest current winning streak in the NHL.

Roy had been the chief culprit against the Blue Jackets, coming in with an 8-0 record and a 1.26 goals-against average. Roy had shut out Columbus 5-0 on Thursday's game night in Denver in what Blue jack-

ets goaltender Marc Denis called an embarrassment.

Riding a two-game shutout streak that began with that game, Roy had not given up a goal in more than 192 minutes when Columbus broke through.

With Colorado ahead 1-0 on Adam Foote's first-period goal, the Blue Jackets set a franchise record for fastest back-to-back goals.

Pirjeta went high over Roy's left shoulder from the right dot for his eighth goal at 12:13.

Before that goal could be announced to a capacity crowd of 18,136, the Blue Jackets had a 2-1 lead when Grant Marshall passed

the puck into the crease from a hard angle and it glanced off of Roy and slid into the net.

“My stick was flat on the ice. I rarely do that,” said Roy, who had 17 saves. “I don't know if I should say it was bad luck or a bad decision on my part. It hit my hand and went in.”

Colorado pulled even 6:16 into the final period when Alex Tanguay pounced on a loose puck near the left dot and beat Denis on the near side.

Colorado had the only three shots in the overtime. In the final seconds, Peter Forsberg carried the puck from mid-ice with Jaroslav Spacek the only defender back with Denis.

Forsberg deked in the high slot but his shot was wide just as the final horn sounded.

“When you get a lead on the road, you would like to be able to get two points, so from that standpoint it was disappointing,” Colorado coach Tony Granato said. “From the other standpoint we were trailing going into the third and we were able to get one (point).”
