

Lady Mustangs pick up big victory over Oakley

The eighth grade girls basketball team overpowered Oakley last Thursday as they stomped them 49-17.

Throughout the entire game, the Goodland girls kept Oakley's scoring to a minimum. In the first quarter, the Lady Mustangs put up 11 points while Oakley had 3. In the second quarter, it was much of the same as Goodland scored 17 and kept Oakley to only 1 basket. At the

halftime break the score was 29-5.

"Our press was very effective in the first half," said head coach Andy Scheopner. "We were able to build up a good lead."

After the break, Oakley's defense worked hard to keep Goodland from scoring, both teams tallied 5 points for the quarter. In the fourth, Goodland's momentum pulled them through and outscored Oakley 15-7, for a final score of 49-17.

Emily Murray led the Lady Mustangs in scoring with 16. Dani

Bedore followed it up with 11. Kaylee Billinger had 7 and Whitney Archer put up 6 points. Lindsay Schields, Stephanie Sheldon, Alicia Studer and Amber Cowan all scored 2, while Nicolette Clancy had 1.

Rebounds were also led by Murray, she had 14. Other rebounds were recorded by Bedore and Archer 8; Billinger 4; Sheldon and Clancy 2; and Studer 1.

Archer had 4 assists while Billinger had 3. Schields, Sheldon, Clancy, Bedore, Murray and

Cowan all had 1 apiece.

On defense, Murray had 7 steals, Bedore 4, Archer 3 and Billinger 2. Sheldon, Studer and Clancy were all able to take the ball from Oakley's possession once.

Afterwards, the "B team" took the floor to play two quarters against Oakley. It was a close game,

but Oakley came out on top 10-7. Goodland score 5 in the first and 2 in the second, while Oakley put up 4 in the first and 6 in the second.

Scoring for Goodland was from a basket apiece from Sandy Johnson, Kerry Bellamy and Crystal Hernandez and a free throw from Candice Meissinger.

Rebounds were recorded for Bellamy and Nicole David 9; Hannah Burkett 5; Whitney Dautel, Meissinger and Hernandez 3; Sheldon 2; and Johnson 1. Bellamy was credited with the only assist of the game. Hernandez had 2 steals while Meissinger, Bellamy, David, Studer and Sheldon all had 1.

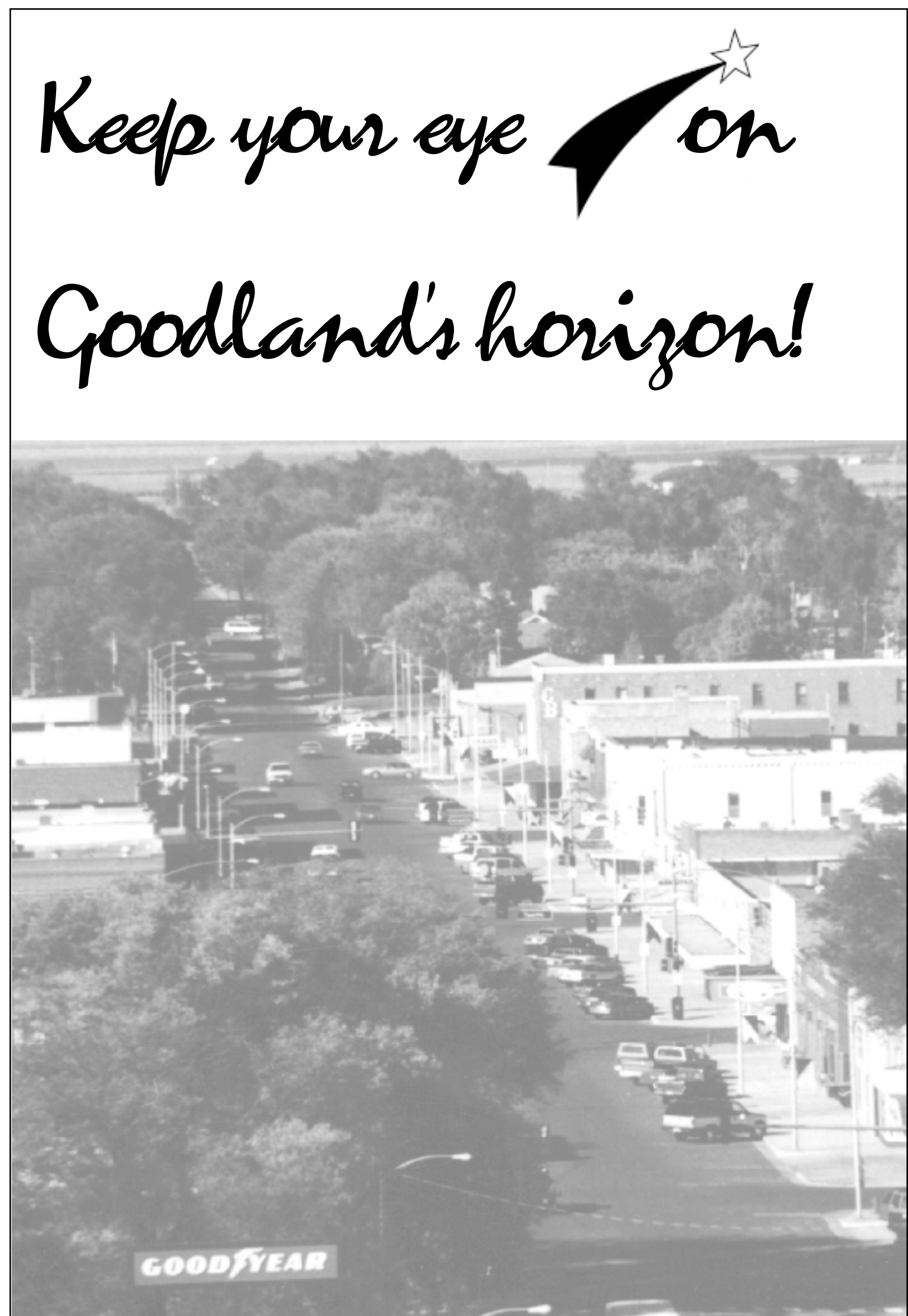
Francis was Ben Johnson's coach when he failed a drug test and was stripped of his gold medal and world record after winning the 100 at the 1988 Seoul Olympics.
