The Goodland Star-news It was a sweet, sweet sound Friday night as the Goodland players and crowd watched Aaron Gittinger's jump shot from the free throw line fall through the hoop with 1.5 seconds left.

The picture-perfect shot gave the Cowboys a hard-earned 73-72 win over the Oberlin Red Devils, topping off a game that wasn't exactly pretty for Goodland.

"We hung tough," Coach John McLean said. "We didn't play as well as we can and there were a lot of tough calls with the officials."

A sputtering Goodland offense found itself behind 20-13 by the end of the first quarter. The Red Devils' height made it difficult for Goodland to get points inside the lane, and the Cowboy's perimeter game was also shut down. They only attempted two shots from beyond the arc in the first quarter. A 7-0 run by Oberlin in the last two minutes put the Red Devils ahead.

The second quarter saw Don Raymer and Jared Doke pick up their third fouls, but the performance of Goodland's offense was much better. Two quick baskets by Raymer against Oberlin's 6-6 Eagan Grafel came in the middle of an 11-0 run for the Cowboys. Also included in that stretch were a trey by Jase Herl, a back-door bucket from Herl to Gittinger, and a charge were unable to get the ball inside.
