Feb. 6, 1903: The proposition to allow women the right to vote for presidential electors was killed in the Kansas senate last week. The women suffragists are not discouraged but will try again and will buttonhole each and every senator to secure his support of the bill.

Feb. 7, 1903: Albert J. Canfield, the eleven year old son of A.B. Canfield, the Rock Island agent here, died of typhoid pneumonia after an illness of three weeks. The little fellow knew what sickness was. For four consecutive winters, he had suffered from an attack of pneumonia, when last winter, acute Bright's disease was super induced, which made life seem as a residence under a permanently shadowed sun.

Feb. 8, 1903: The Seaman sisters, milliners, have purchased the I.H. Van Hook residence east of the Methodist Church. It is a desirable property and at present is occupied by the Floyd family.

Feb. 9, 1903: Will Prosecute the Joints — County Attorney Murphy says he means business. The alarming amount of money each month filched from the public hurts business, pollutes public morals. County Attorney E.F. Murphy has served notice on all the joints and gambling houses that they must close down by Feb. 20 or he will prosecute them for violating the laws of the state.

He does not hold them responsible for any past violations of the prohibitory and gambling laws, but he says in plain and unmistakable language that after Feb. 20, if they do not turn over a new leaf and quit their meanness, he will tend to them.

The official procedure will effect the saloons conducted by A.L. Cullens, "Doc" Phillips and Jerry Coffin and the gambling dens in all of these places. Mr. Murphy says that his action is caused by no malicious motives whatever toward the individuals.

His declaration cannot be mistaken or misconstrued, and the public will watch the outcome of the matter.

Saloons and gambling houses have run openly in Goodland for years in violation of the law, the one a misdemeanor, the other a felony, and a part of the time they city has practically been a partner in the business, and for the stipulated share of the profits has extended to them its protection against the state.
