

# Eighth grade girls beat St. Francis and Quinter

The eighth grade girls from Grant Junior High added two more wins to their record last week as they defeated St. Francis on Tuesday and Quinter on Thursday.

Goodland pulled out the easy win against St. Francis by topping the Lady Indians, 53-10. In the first quarter, the Mustangs started the game by holding Sainty to just 3 points while scoring 15 of their own.

Charged up, the Goodland girls didn't let up in the second quarter. They completely shut down St. Francis' scoring and put 18 points on the score board. The score at the half was 33-3.

After the break, Goodland scored 16 in the third while St. Francis had 4. In the final quarter, the girls allowed 3 St. Francis points and scored 4, for the final score of 53-10.

The Lady Mustangs had three girls score in the double digits, Kaylee Billinger 12; Whitney Archer 11; and Dani Bedore 10. Other points were tallied by Emily Murray 8, Jena McCall 6, Alicia Studer 4 and Nicole David 2.

Rebounds were credited to Murray 7; Bedore 6; Billinger,

Nicolette Clancy and David 4; McCall and Kerri Bellamy 3; Lindsay Schields, Archer, Stephanie Sheldon and Studer 2; and Amber Cowan 1.

Assisting were Billinger 4; Schields and Archer 3; Studer 2; and Sheldon, Clancy, Bedore, Murray and Cowan 1 each.

One thing that was reflected in the final score was the fact that Goodland had 27 steals. Murray had 6; Billinger and Bedore 5; Cowan 4; Archer and McCall 2; and Schields, Studer and Sandy Johnson 1.

During the B team game, Goodland scored 4 points to St. Francis' 2. The Lady Mustangs' points were from baskets by Bellamy and Crystal Hernandez. Rebounds were made by Candice Meissinger 5; Whitney Dautel 2; and Bellamy, Hernandez, Hannah Burkett and Amber Webster 1. Johnson and Meissinger each had an assist each and Dautel, Johnson, Meissinger, Bellamy and Hernandez each recorded a steal.

In the Thursday game with Quinter, it was a closer final score as Goodland took the 51-40 win.

Goodland took an early lead, 23-15, by scoring 14 in the first quarter and 9 in the second. Quinter had

8 points in the first and 7 in the second.

After the break, Quinter was fired up and came back to outscore Goodland in the third quarter, 11-9.

As Quinter rallied in the fourth quarter, they cut Goodland's lead to only 3 points, but the Lady Mustangs increased the margin. Scoring in the fourth quarter was Goodland 19, Quinter 14.

"This was the most exciting game we've had this year," said coach Andy Scheopner.

Archer lead the team in scoring with 17 points, Bedore followed with 16, Murray had 8, Schields 5, Billinger 4 and McCall 1.

Rebounds were Murray 9, Archer 7, Bedore 5, Billinger 2 and Schields, Clancy, Cowan and McCall one each.

Schields and Billinger each had 4 assists each, while Archer and Murray had 3. Steals were tallied by Murray; Bedore and Archer 3; Billinger 2; Schields, Sheldon and Studer 1.

In the B team game, two six-minute quarters were played. Goodland lost to Quinter 11-6. Goodland's points were made by Dautel, Meissinger and Bellamy who all had a basket each.

## Cowboys defeat Hugoton in Saturday game, 62-51

The Goodland High Cowboys beat the Hugoton Eagles 62-51 in a road game Saturday, staking out a big lead in the second quarter and hanging on against a comeback in the final round.

Things appeared to be fairly even through the first quarter, with both teams scoring 14 points, but Goodland took charge in the second quarter. By the half, the Cowboys had pulled out to a 36-22 lead.

After halftime, Goodland kept

their momentum and outscored Hugoton 20-13 in the third quarter, for a score of 56-35.

Hugoton attempted to recover in the fourth and put up 16 points while holding Goodland to only 6, but it was far short of what the Eagles needed. Goodland claimed victory by a final score of 62-51.

Don Raymer led the Cowboys, scoring 32 point, over half of the total. Lance Tedford was the only other Cowboy in the double figures with 11. Aaron Gittinger had 8; Jared Doke and Jase Herl 3 each;

Kris Rubio and Wade Taylor 2; and Bill Linin 1.

Goodland shot 47 percent from the field, shooting 51 percent (25-49) of their field goals and 25 percent (2-8) of their attempted three-pointers. From the charity stripe, the Cowboys were nearly 55 percent (6-11).

Hugoton shot 38 percent from the field, shooting 38 percent (16-42) for two pointers and 20 percent (3-15) of three-pointers. The Eagles sank 10 of their 20 free throws for 50 percent.
