The win brings the Cowboys record to 10-4.

"We shot pretty well and our defense wasn't bad," said Cowboy Coach Jon McLean. "I was pleased with the way we rebounded and our passing seemed to improve. We missed some shots we should have had, but it was a good game for us.

"It was good to see Bobby Miller getting into the flow and he got some good rebounds for us," McLean said. "It keeps us undefeated in league play, and gives us a four-game winning streak."

Looking ahead McLean thinks the game tonight against St. Francis will be a good one, but that if the boys play as well as they have and continue to improve they should have a good chance to win.

"The tough one will be when we go to Hays on Saturday," he said. "That will be one of the toughest we have played in some time."

The Cowboys will face St. Francis tonight at 7 p.m., and travel to Hays Saturday with tip-off 20 minutes after the girls varsity game which begins at 5 p.m.
