Girl Scouts to celebrate World Thinking Day

Worldwide 10 million girls involved

On Saturday, Feb. 22, Girl Scouts will be thinking about nearly 10 million other girls around the world as they celebrate their international friendships during World Thinking Day 2003.

In northwest Kansas, some Girl Scout troops will celebrate the day by writing letters to pen pals in other parts of the state and country and by wearing different shoes to show their understanding of the differences in our world.

World Thinking Day, which began in 1926, focuses on interna-

tional connections among girls. On this day, Girl Scouts nationwide will learn about different languages, plant flowers found in other countries, sample international foods and celebrate at international festivals and bazaars.

"This year, especially, it's important to embrace and celebrate the differences among our international friends," said Linda Mills, executive director of the Sunflower

Council. "By encouraging girls to think globally today, we are helping to develop tomorrow's decision makers and world leaders."

In honor of World Thinking Day, communities are encouraged to reflect on the importance of building international connections among youth and consider supporting the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund. This fund, created in memory of the founder of the national orga-

nization, helps to extend Scouting to girls worldwide, enables girls to travel abroad, and supports international friendships through community service projects.

There are more than 3.8 million girls and adults in Girl Scouts in the United States.

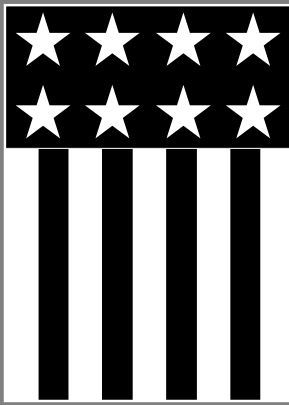
Sunflower Council serves 1,350 girls and adults in 16 northwest Kansas counties, including Goodland.

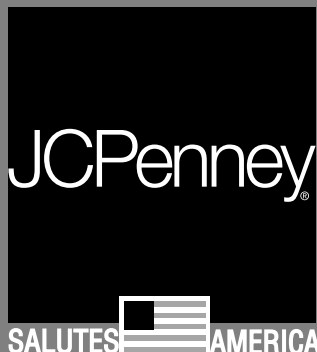

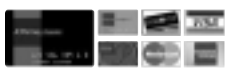
