

School principals report building activity

 Principals from all Goodland schools except North Elementary School gave reports at the school board meeting last Monday.

Jim Mull, principal at Grant Junior High, reported that the junior high will be receiving its accreditation on March 11. Mull said the approval comes after a lot of hard work by a lot of people.

He reported the spelling bee had been held at the school and the music festival in Hays was attended by junior high students.

Mull also said seventh-grade students will be taking their math assessments on-line this year. Goodland has been approved to allow all of their students to take the test on computers, Mull said, but if some students need to take the standard test, they can

At Central Elementary School, Sharon Gregory reported, her students are participating the Sherman County Conservation District's poster and limerick contest.

Art from elementary students is on display at the Goodland Arts Center through the month of February.

A digital photo of the child will be taken and put on a card with their thumb print. The cards are then given back to parents for safekeeping and can be used if the child is lost or abducted.

Burkett said Math Power Activities have started this week. Students are split into six groups and are revisiting the concepts of math in preparation for assessment tests.

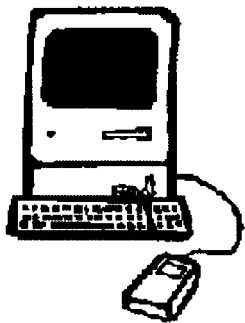
Through a grant from Smart Start, he said, two aides are going back to school. The grant pays for 80 percent of their tuition, books and mileage.

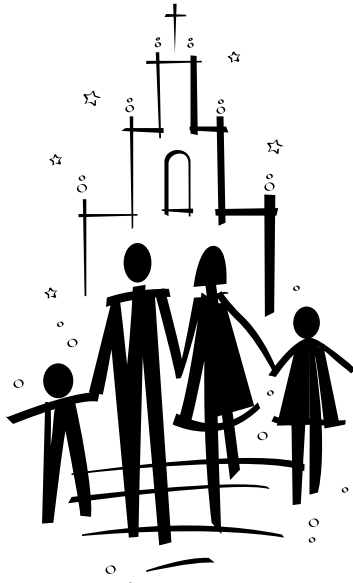
