

1A Regional starts in Brewster

The Brewster Bulldog basketball team will play its first game of the Class 1A regional basketball tournament tonight in Brewster when they take on Northern Valley at 7 p.m. Central time. If they win that game, they will face either Golden Plains or Cheylin Friday night at the Max Jones Fieldhouse at 7:30 p.m.

The Lady Bulldogs had a bye Monday night in the first round of the girl's regional, and will play either Cheylin or Northern Valley Thursday at 6 p.m. Mountain time at the Fieldhouse.

Saturday, the regional girls championship starts at 6 p.m. at the

Fieldhouse, and the boys title game is scheduled for 7:30.

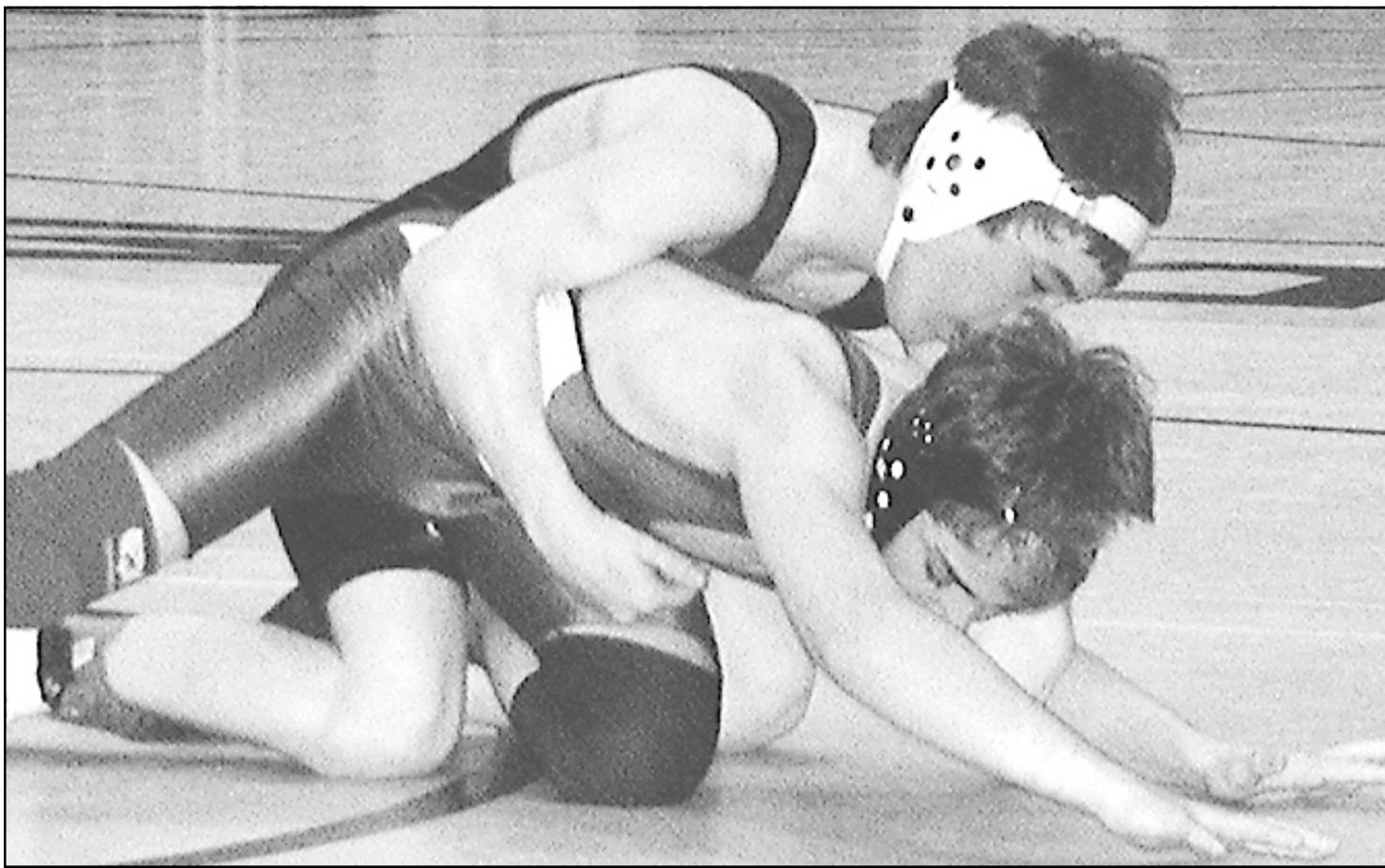

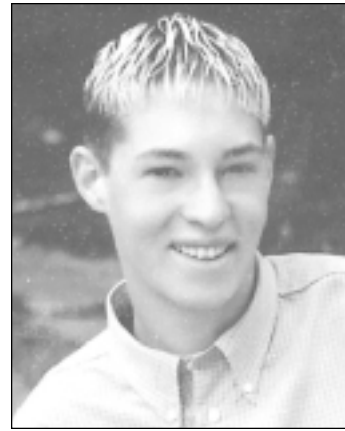
