Cowboys lose last regular game to Norton boys

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys let a 10point lead slip away in the final minutes of regulation play Tuesday night in Norton, then fell short in overtime, suffering a 73-69 loss to the Blue Jays to finish the regular season.

We played good for 30 minutes," Coach Jon McLean said, "then let it slip the last two minutes. It's disappointing to lose, but I still thought we played well."

It was a hard-fought game all the way, with the teams tied at 18 after one quarter. The score at the half was 34-31 Goodland. After three quarters, Goodland was up by six points, and the Cowboys led by 10 with two minutes left.

That's when Norton turned up the pressure, and the Cowboys experienced what all teams experience at one time or another: A massive shift in momentum where anything can happen for the team on top. Norton tied the game with a free throw with a few seconds left, then out-scored the Cowboys 10-6 in overtime.

When you lose momentum," McLean said, "you lose a lot. Norton really got after us on the press. Everything was going right for them, and nothing was going right for us."

The Cowboys (13-7) got production from everyone who played, McLean said.

"All eight players gave us something," he said. "Jared Doke came in off the bench and gave us 10 points and 3 rebounds. (Aaron)

Gittinger gave us eight points and seven assists. Everyone contributed.'

The Cowboys are the No. 4 seed and will play at home Monday night in the first round of the Class 4A sub-state tournament. They'll take on Hugoton at 5:15 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

'We've already beaten Hugoton a couple of times this year," McLean said, but we're not going to take them for granted. This is substate basketball now, and anything can happen.

"The team is playing good basketball, and this is the time of year that I want them to be playing good."

If they get past Hugoton, they'll play either Larned (14-5) or Concordia (8-11) Thursday night at the Colby Community Building.

The Goodland Cowgirls held off a determined Norton squad to win 58-49 Tuesday night in Norton.

Senior Anny McCoy played just 16 minutes, but led the Cowgirls with 21 points. Jayci Stone scored 18 points, including three baskets from downtown. Jessica Osborn also scored in double figures, with 11 points.

"I'm glad the girls played well," said Cowgirl coach Connie Livengood. "Now it's time to get ready for sub-state."

The Cowgirls had a 12-point lead at halftime, 36-24, but came out cold and scored only six points in the third quarter. Fortunately, Norton scored just four, before exploding for 21 points in the final stanza.. Goodland scored 16 in the fourth to hold the win.

Also scoring for the Cowgirls were Whitney Čarmichael, Kendra Billinger, Stephanie Fairbanks and Cortney Schields had two each.

The Cowgirls improved to 15-5 for the year, and secured the No. 4 seed in the sub-state tournament for their game with Pratt. That will be at 6 p.m. Mountain Time Tuesday at Hays High School. The game is at Hays, rather than Goodland, because Pratt, the lower-seeded team, is more than 150 miles distant, and Hays is roughly halfway.
