

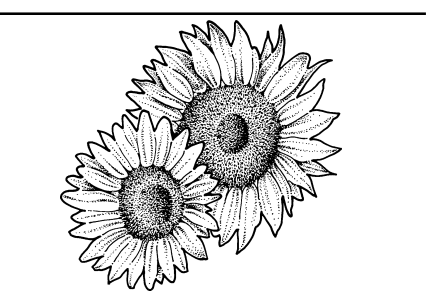

Sarah Short and Gwen Cebula have given much of their time and effort which club members really appreciate. Short has been an advisor for about 37 years and Cebula for about eight years.

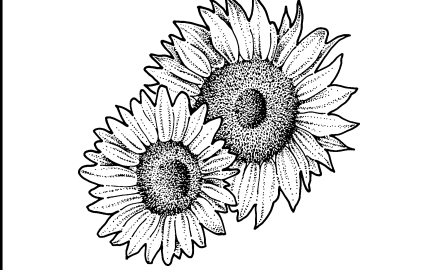
As advisors, they make sure the students are meeting deadlines for their projects and are there for support when the students go to perform.


