goodland in 1903

today in history

March 11, 1903: Two More Sections of Land Handed Over to Dewey Control — Sam Vassar sold his land holdings in Voltaire township to the Dewey Cattle company. His ranch included a section of deeded land and a lease on an adjoining school section, 1,280 acres in all. His ranch was well improved, having large cattle sheds, a house and barn, wells and one section under fence. The consideration is said to be \$1,700. Mr. Vassar said that had he been perfectly free to choose, he would not have sold out, but that the extensive holdings of the Dewey company in that part of the county urged him to make the transfer. It is reported hat the Dewey company has also bought out Ben Jayne, Jack Reeper, H.A. Spencer and J.E. Henson, farmers in the north part of the county.

Some of the men who have sold are satisfied with the price paid and received perhaps more money for their land than they could have sold it for a few years ago. But real estate has advanced in price, and a number of the best bottom farms in the county have been bought up by the Dewey company It is evident to everybody that their cattle venture is a losing game, but what is lost in cattle will be made up in the rise of land values. The Dewey operations in northwestern Kansas seem to have been for their ultimate and gigantic real estate scheme rather than a cattle venture.

March 12, 1903: From Over the County — Grant Township — Snow, snow! We have all from \$8 to \$6; one to two years, been yearning these long years for from \$12 to \$10; two to three plenty of snow to insure a crop, and years, from \$20 to \$18; three at last our hopes have been rewarded. But, alas! Our feed stacks are melting down like a snowball under a tropic sun, causing much uneasiness among our ranch men.

We, as humans, are hard to please. Nearly everyone is out of grub and feed.

Ruleton Items — D.A. Long says that he "will be an expert skinner if it keeps on snowing." Two emigrant wagons passed through Ruleton, after the big storm, on their way west. Mr. Bickett, the section foreman, says he wants all the hands he can get.
