James Bollig

James Richard Bollig, 75, a Littleton, Colo., accountant and brother of Alfred Bollig of Goodland, died Sunday, March 9, 2003, in Englewood, Colo.

He was born Oct. 3, 1927, on a farm by the Saline River, the third of 13 children of Peter John and Elizabeth (Meier) Bollig.

Bollig joined the Marines when he was 16 and was wounded in Iwo Jima and received the Purple Heart. He was a corporal in the Marines, serving during the Pacific Campaign from April 15, 1944, and March 20, 1947.

After his discharge, Bollig went back home and finished high school. Between 1950 and 1952, he owned a two-seater airplane and flew over Kansas. He attended Denver University and Regis College. Bollig became an accountant and stayed with the same company, retiring as the chief financial officer of Broderick Wood Lumber Co.

Bollig moved into Mariner of Greenwood Village in January of 2002 and enjoyed joking with neighbors and playing bingo.

On Nov. 2, 1973, he married June Ballard, his second wife.

Preceding him in death were five brothers, Andrew, Gustav, Henry, Eugene and Edwin; and a sister, Rose Marie Nondorf.

Other survivors include three daughters, Cindy (Jerry) VanDonge of Goodland, Vicki (Jim) Queen of Denver and Paula Bollig of Phoenix; a step-son, Tom Ballard; three step-daughters, Amy, Kim and JoAnna Ballard; three more brothers, William Bollig of Denver, Fidelis Bollig of Phoenix, Ariz., and Jerome Bollig of Henderson, Nev.; two sisters, Josephine Polach of Junction City and Vera Parke of Hays; six grandchildren; and numerous step-grandchildren.

The mass of Christian burial was at 8:30 a.m. this morning, Friday, March 14, 2003, at the Archdiocese of Denver Mortuary. Burial will be in the Fort Logan National Cemetery.

H. Keith Wingerd, 78, father of Jean Johnson of Goodland, died Monday, March 10, 2003, at the Abilene Memorial Hospital.

He was born Feb. 21, 1925, in Navarre, the son of Harvey G. and Emma (Rhodes) Wingerd. He grew up in Navarre and graduated from Chapman High School in 1942.

Mr. Wingerd served in the Army Air Corp as a gunner on a B-17 in England during World War II.

He graduated from Kansas State University in 1948. On July 2, 1950, he married Marjorie Skinner in Trenton, Mo. They spent the early years of their marriage in Wichita, where he worked for Nabisco Food Co.

The Wingerds moved to Navarre in 1952, where they operated the Wingerd Grocery until 1974. He was then a meat inspector for the state until retiring in 2000.

He had served on the board of the Enterprise Estates Nursing Home and was a member of the Navarre Senior Center and the Dickinson County Historical Society.

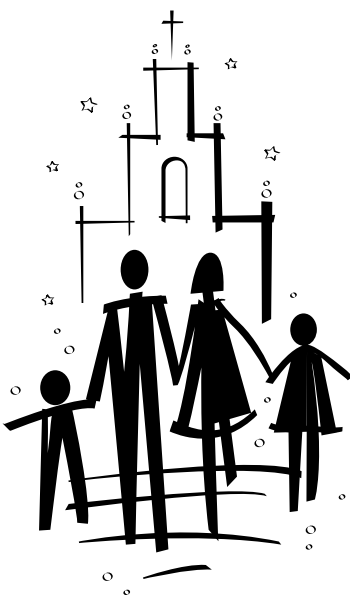
