National Library Week being celebrated

"Celebrate at Your Library!" is the theme for National Library Week this week, and the staff and board members of the Goodland Public Library are asking people to come down and see what is available.

"There is something for everyone at the library," said Director Janet Warren. "Today, more than ever, libraries provide a variety of resources to help people of all ages to read, learn and connect with resources they need for school, work

or personal fulfillment."

Besides fiction and non-fiction books, the library offers large-print books, reference books, children's books, magazines, newspapers, video cassettes and books on cassette and compact disc.

Reading material can be borrowed from other libraries, and patrons can access the Internet and other activities on computers. The library offers a story hour, has tax forms and has back issues of Goodland and Sherman County

newspapers.

Through the interlibrary loan network, the library can borrow materials from libraries across the state and nation. The library received over 1,200 items on interlibrary loan last year.

The library offers eight computers with Internet access for patrons. All of the computers on the network offer local card catalog, word processing programs and other computer resources and educational games.

Library receives nearly \$2,000 in grants

The Goodland Public Library will be able to buy additional audio titles and materials for pre-school story hour, thanks to grants from the Kansas Library Network Board and the Kansas State Library.

Director Janet Warren said the library will be spending the money on classic and popular fiction titles on audio cassette and compact disc.

The \$1,000 grant is part of the \$71,607 the board gave to 39 applicants.

The library has a lot of demand for audio books, Warren said. Users will benefit from having more materials in the collection, and the library will be able to contribute more to the interlibrary loan network.

Interlibrary loan allows people to

borrow materials from libraries across the state through their local libraries. The network gives the grants to libraries that agree to make the materials available through the program, she said.

Warren said the Kansas State Library gave the Goodland library a special populations grant of \$900 for pre-school story hour materials.
