

Bowling raises funds for Big Brothers-Big Sisters

Top fund raiser brings in \$740 for program

The lanes at Bowladium were busy Saturday as 28 teams bowled to raise money for Sherman County Big Brothers-Big Sisters.

Dennis Daise, program director, said the 112 bowlers raised an estimated gross of \$6,000, but there are some expenses to be paid out of that.

The teams began at 11 a.m. with a ceremonial rolling of the first ball by Jerry Amthor representing Bowladium Lanes.

The top pledge raiser was Patty Howard, who had \$740.

Each team rolled two games, and the score from the first was used to set the number of pins. The City of Goodland team had the high score with 618.

The Sherman County Commissioners led by Commissioner Mitch Tiede had a score of 399. A team from North Elementary led by Britany Medrano had 194.

pice team led by Michelle Smith, 438; and the Yellow Submarines led by Sam Valles, 340.

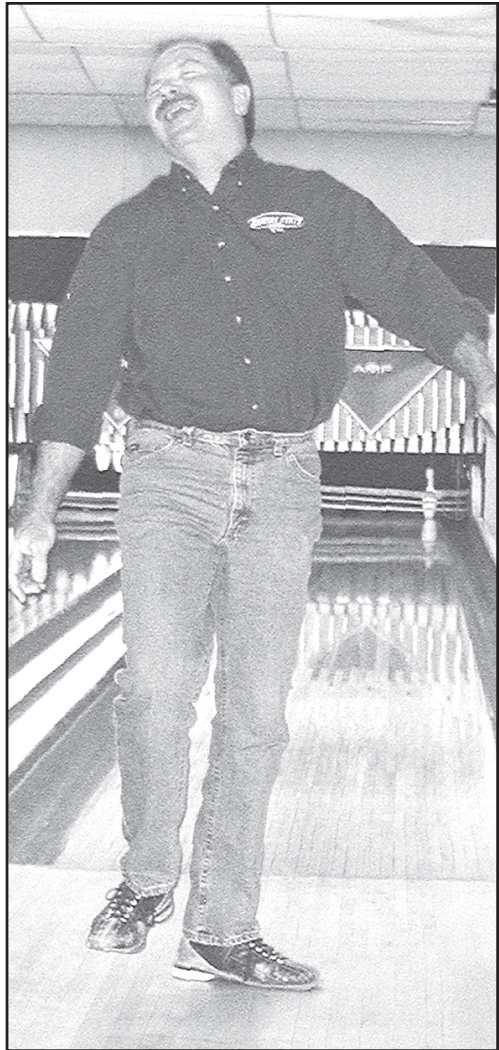
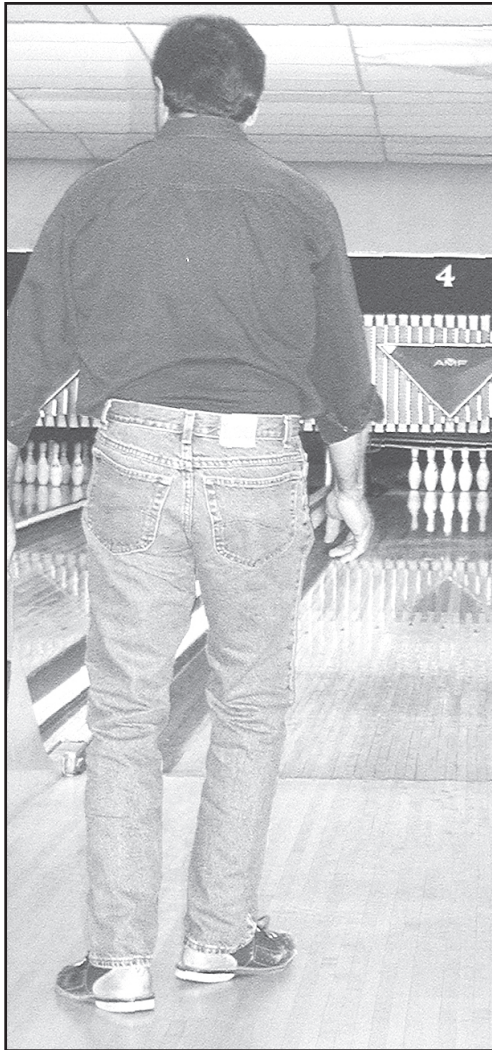
