

Team sweeps Colby

Cowgirls take two in doubleheader

The Goodland High varsity softball team won its first two games of the season, outscoring Colby 8-0 and 12-11 on Friday before a home crowd.

After two dates had to be canceled because of bad weather, the Cowgirls finally were able to get on the field and show what they can do.

Britany Pettibone pitched both games, holding the Colby girls to two hits in the first game with only one walk and seven strikeouts. In the second game, she was still able to get the seven strike outs while walking only one, but the Eagles hit eight hits and produced 11 runs.

"Britany pitched an excellent (first) game and we played great defense," said Coach Terry Daise.

"(In the second game) we hit the ball very well, but we didn't play very good defense, committing too many errors. We were fortunate to win this game." Tomi Windell hit the only home run for the Cowgirls in the second game.

Scoring in game one were Shanae Calkins, 2, and Stephanie Fairbanks, Pettibone, Alissa Schields, Windell, Thompson and Courtney Schields, 1 each.

Outlaws defeat Garden

Goodland's Outlaws baseball team continued their winning ways on Thursday, taking a doubleheader from the Garden City Buffaloes junior varsity, 8-6 and 5-4.

They had to come from four runs behind in both games to get the sweep.

"We played with a lot heart in both games," said Coach Bud Rice, "especially when we had to come from behind.

"Both pitchers did well, and our defense played good."

He credited Travis Hilt with starting the rally during the first game, and felt it was the turning point.

In the first game, the Outlaws took a 1-0 lead when Kyle Schulte scored from second on a bunt by Jake Alander.

The Buffaloes tied the score in the second, and it remained, 1-1 until the fifth, when the Buffaloes took advantage of two Outlaw errors to score three runs and take a momentary lead, 4-1.

The Outlaws answered in the bottom of the fifth as Hilt opened with a triple, and scored when Kyle Schulte reached base on a Buffalo error. Cole Reiger got a walk, and Landon West reached on another Buffalo error that scored a run.

Brock Lohr reached base on a fielders choice. Lane Winter got a base hit, driving in a run, and Tyrel Rall's triple scored another run to give the Outlaws a 7-4 lead.

The Outlaws added one run in the sixth on a base hit by Reiger, who was driven home by a single from Lohr to make it an 8-4 game.

The Buffaloes tried to come back in the seventh, scoring two runs on to base hits and an Outlaw error.

The winning pitcher was West, who went the distance. He gave up seven hits, four singles and three doubles, and struck out eight.

In the second game, the Buffaloes took a 1-0 lead in the first, and added three in the second to hold a commanding 4-0 lead.

In the fifth, Alander started the Outlaw comeback with a base hit, and then stole second. He was sent home by West, and then a base hit by Hilt scored West to make it 4-2.

In the sixth, Kevin Schulte got on base on a Buffalo error, and stole second. He scored on a triple by West. West scored from third on a balk by the Buffalo pitcher to tied the game at 4.

Reiger had a base hit and stole second. He scored the go-ahead run when Winter reached base on a Buffalo error, making it 5-4 after six.

In the seventh, the Buffaloes

managed to get one man on base, but were unable to score.

The winning pitcher for the Outlaws was Kevin Schulte, who pitched a complete game. He gave up five hits, three singles and two doubles and struck out seven.

The Outlaws record is 4-0 and they will play at 3 p.m. on Thursday at Ellis. The next home game will

be at 3 p.m. on Monday, when they face Colby.

Manager Liz West said there seems to be some confusion about why the Outlaws are always playing junior varsity teams. She said if they were to play a varsity team, it would count as one of their 20 maximum games, but could not be counted in their team record for playoffs.
