Cowgirls 12th at Wichita track meet

The Goodland High School track team split up last Friday, with the more experienced members going to the K.T. Woodman meet in Wichita, where the girls came in 12th and the boys 25th.

The younger members headed for Norton, where the boys came in sixth and the girls seventh.

The Wichita meet is huge, with 25 Class 3A and 4A schools vying for honors at Cessna Stadium.

Senior Jayci Stone was the outstanding athlete for Goodland as she took a second in the pole vault and a pair of sixths in the 400-meter dash and high jump. Kendra Billinger also gave the girls a boost with her second place in the 1,600-meter run.

Taylor Brack tied for fifth in the pole vault and Jordan Bedore took sixth in the discus for the boys.

Up in Norton, Daniel Blake took first in the 3,200-meter run and fifth in the 1,600 meters, Lance Tedford took third in the long jump, Bret Jarmin took fourths in the 200-meter dash and the javelin toss,

Jared Doke fourth in the 800-meter dash, Josef Felver, fifth in the 200-meter dash, and Dan Bagnell sixth in the discus for the boys. The 4X100-meter boys relay team took third.

Alisha McKee tossed the shot for first while Kara Angelos came in fourth in both the 100- and 300-meter hurdles. Tiffany Thomas took fourth in the 3,200-meter run and fifth in the 1,600 meters. Jessica Osborn was fourth in javelin.

The Goodland freshmen and sophomores came in seventh for the girls and eighth for the boys at the school's 9-10 track meet on Monday, mostly because there weren't many of them on the field.

Besides the fact that there are not many freshmen and sophomores out for track this year, said Coach Don Smith, the varsity attended a meet in LaCrosse on Tuesday and many of the students who would normally have participated at home went on the road with the varsity team.

The LaCrosse meet was a late addition to the track schedule to make up for one in Ogallala, Neb., which was snowed out on April 5.

On the girls side, St. Francis won the meet with 110 points followed by Colby, 84; Burlington, 63; Ulysses, 45; Hoxie, 32; Scott City, 28; Goodland, 27; and Tribune, 16.

On the boys side, Ulysses was the winner with 160 points, followed by Burlington, 111; Tribune, 108; St. Francis, 46; Colby, 34; Scott

City, 33; Hoxie, 18; and Goodland, 8.

Lisha Tedford was the only gold medal winner for the Cowgirls, getting a first in the discus.

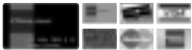
