

Outlaws take Colby for a ride as they dump the Eagles 4-2

The Colby junior varsity came to town Monday but went home with a pair of losses as the Goodland Outlaws protected their home field with strikeouts and hits.

The Goodland team had more errors than they should, but the Outlaws still won the first 4-2 game and the second 11-8.

“Our Outlaws had lots of errors,” said manager Liz West. “(They) had lots of errors because they tried some new things. (They) still need to work on stuff.”

In the first game, pitcher Brock Lohr kept the Colby boys off the bases in first inning as the first man, Cranston, was out at first; the second, Powell, flew out to right, where it was caught by Brandon Zelfer; and third, Mardock, stuck out.

The Outlaw half of the first was quick as Kyle Schulte, Cale Rieger and Jake Alander, all struck out.

In the second, Lohr struck out Quenzer, had Beiker hit a fly to center field, where it was caught by Kyle Schulte; and struck out Harris.

As the Outlaws took to the plate, Travis Hilt got a base hit and stole second, but Tyrel Rall and Brandon Zelfer both struck out.

The score stood at 0-0 at the end of two.

In the top of the third, Reed walked, Dietz flied out to center and Schultz threw the ball back in for a double play. Next up, Saddler walked and Cranston reached on an error.

The last man up was Powell, who hit the ball back to the pitcher, who threw it on to Hilt at first for the last out.

Wyatt Dautel was the first Outlaw to the plate in the third, and he hit the ball back to the pitcher for an out at first. Then Derrek Fenner stuck out.

The top of the Outlaw order came up as Kyle Schulte got a base hit. He later stole a base and came home to score as Rieger, up next, got a base hit. Rieger went to second on an error, but was stranded when Alander

hit back to the pitcher for the third out.

The Outlaws were on the board, though, 1-0.

In the fourth, Kevin Schulte took over as pitcher and struck out Mardock. Quenzer reached on an error but the next two men, Beiker and Harris both struck out.

The pitcher Kevin Schulte was up first in the bottom of the fourth, and he was out at first. Hilt got a base hit

and Rall got a double. With men on second and third, Zelfer got a single and an RBI as Hilt came home. Dautel struck out. Landon West came to the plate and got a triple, scoring Rall and Zelfer. Kyle Schulte hit a fly to center for the last out.

The Outlaws led 4-0 at the end of four.

In the fifth, Colby's Reed hit to first and was out, but Dietz reached on an error. He was later picked off between first and second. Saddler struck out.

The Outlaws went one, two, three as Rieger hit to third and was out at first, Alander hit to the pitcher and was out at first and Kevin Schulte struck out.

In the top of the sixth, Cranston stuck out, Powell hit to the pitcher and was out at first and Mardock stuck out.

In the bottom, Hilt was out at first,

Rall hit to second and was out at first and Lane Winter stuck out.

The Colby boys made a run for it in the seventh, as Quenzer reached on an error and Beiker got a base hit and brought Quenzer home for Colby's first run. Harris struck out but Reed got a base hit and Beiker came home for a second Colby run. Saddler and Cranston both struck out to end the game with a 4-2 Outlaw victory.

Eagles fly in for game, but drag tails home after second loss

The Goodland Outlaw baseball team beat the Colby junior varsity 11-8 in the second game of a doubleheader on Monday in Goodland.

The Outlaws won the first game handily and looked like they were going to run away with the second. However, in the seventh inning, the Colby boys put up a fight. The Outlaws hung on to take the game, however.

Landon West was the Outlaw pitcher. Up first for Colby, Cranston hit a fly ball to the short stop, Kyle Schulte, for the first out. Powell was hit by a pitch. Dietz hit to second and was out at first but Quenzer reached on an error and Powell came home to score the first run for Colby. Reed struck out to end the first half inning.

The Outlaws started out big, as Kyle Schulte doubled, Cale Rieger walked and later stole second. Kevin Schulte was out on a fly to center. West hit to third and was out at first but got an RBI as Kyle Schulte came home. Rieger made it home on an error and Brock Lohr stuck out.

At the end of one, the score was 2-1 in favor of the Outlaws.

West struck out the side in the second inning, Beiker, Harris and Mardock.

With the Outlaws up, Travis Hilt walked and stole second. Matt Zollinger stuck out and Lane Winter reached on an error and stole second. Brandon Zelfer double home Hilt and Winter. Kyle Schulte stuck out and Rieger hit a fly to right to end the inning.

That made the score was 4-1 in favor of the Outlaws.

In the third, Saddler reached on an error and Cranston got a base hit. Powell struck out and Dietz got on base on a fielder's choice (West to Wyatt Dautel). Then Cranston was picked off to end the Colby half of the inning.

In the Outlaws' half of the third, Kevin Schulte walked, stole second and later came home on a balk. West flied out to first and Lohr got a base hit. Hilt got on base on a fielder's choice as Lohr was picked off and Zollinger hit to the short stop for the final out.

Colby went down in order as Quenzer, Reed and Beiker all stuck out in the top of the fourth.

Winter got a base hit for the Outlaws and later stole second. Zelfer flew out to center field and

Kyle Schulte got a base hit to score Winter. He later stole second but was eventually put out at home. Rieger reached on an error and Kevin Schulte got a base hit, scoring Rieger, and later stole a base. West came to the plate and doubled in Kevin Schulte for the Outlaws' third run of the inning. Lohr flied out to the short stop to end it.

In the fifth, Colby again went without an noise as Harris, Mardock and Saddler all struck out.

In the bottom of the fifth Hilt flew out to the pitcher, Zollinger hit to second for an out, Winter reached on an error but Zelfer flew to second for a quick inning.

Tyrel Rall took over the ball for the Outlaws in the sixth.

Cranston got a base hit then Powell doubled scoring Cranston. Dietz doubled scoring Powell but was later put out at home. Quenzer hit to second and was out at first. Reed hit to the pitcher and was out at first.

Dautel was the first Outlaw to the plate in the bottom of the sixth. He struck out. Alander reached on an error. Kevin Schulte stuck out but West tripled, bringing in Alander, and Lohr got a base hit to bring in West. Derrek Fenner also got a base hit, bringing in Lohr for three more runs in the inning. Zollinger stuck out to end it.

In the top of the seventh, Beiker got a base hit and so did Harris. Mardock's base hit scored Beiker. Saddler stuck out. Cranston got a base hit to score Harris. Powell was hit by a pitch and Dietz hit to the short stop, who threw on to first to put him out. He got an RBI on the fielder's choice. Quenzer also got a base hit and an RBI, and the Colby team had a threat going but only one more out. Reed walked but Beiker hit to first for the last out of the game and the Outlaws won 11-8.
