### Loren Whipps

Loren E. Whipps, 92, of Garden City, a former Sherman County High School teacher and retired extension agent, died Thursday, April 24, 2003, at St. Catherine Hospital in Garden City. He was born Feb. 16, 1911, at Belleville, the son of Edgar and Lorhetta Mosher Whipps, and graduated from Belleville High School. On June 21, 1953, he married Lucille Rosenberger in Greensburg. Following two years of pre-veterinary study at Kansas State College, he returned home to assist on the family farm and taught for two years at two one-room country schools. In 1938, he graduated from Kansas State with an agricultural economics major and a minor in agricultural education. He was a member of the Acacia Fraternity. In 1953, he obtained a master's degree in agricultural education from Colorado State University. He taught vocational agriculture for five years at Sherman County High School. In 1942, he volunteered for the Navy Air Corps, serving four years in World War II as a chief petty officer. After one year as a county extension agent in Osborne County, he began as the vocational agriculture teacher/trainer at Kansas State University in Manhattan and continued for eight years. He also served five years as assistant state supervisor for the Board of Vocational Education in Topeka. In order to return to his pleasure in "grass roots" work, he served as the Sherman County extension

agent from 1959-66. He then moved to Garden City to serve eight years as the Kansas State area extension economist and served two years as the southwest Kansas area extension 4-H specialist. He retired from the extension service in July 1976 and later taught at Garden City Community College and served for 12 years as a substitute teacher in the schools there. During his career, he served as a panel member for *Kansas Farmer* and *Successful Farming* magazines for many years. He was a member of the Garden City First United Methodist Church, a 50-year member of the Tyrian Masonic Lodge and of the Rotary Club, serving as president of the Goodland Rotary Club. He belonged to the Midian Shrine Temple of Wichita and was a member of the Epsilon Sigma Phi Extension Professional Fraternity. He was a life member of the Kansas State Alumni Association and the Garden City Horticulture Club and a 30-year member of the Garden City Kennel Club. Preceding him in death were his parents and a brother, John Quincy Whipps. Survivors include his wife; a brother, Leonard (Ruth) Whipps of Ursa, Ill.; a brother-in-law, John (LaVerne) Rosenberger, and a sister-in-law, Lois (Irving) Neier, both of Greensburg. Services were at 10 a.m. Monday, April 28, 2003, at the church with the Rev. Linda Bolz officiating. Burial was at 3:30 p.m. Monday in Fairview Cemetery in Greensburg. Visitation was from 10 a.m.-8 p.m. Saturday and from noon-8 p.m. Sunday at Price and Sons Funeral Home in Garden City.

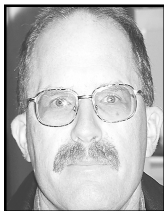
# Board puts time into helping kids
