

Junior varsity softball team downs Colby, falls to Hays, Ulysses

The Goodland High junior varsity softball girls had a down-up-down ending for April, as they lost two in Hays on April 22, won a pair in Colby on April 25 and ended up with another pair of losses in Ulysses on April 29.

On April 22, the Cowgirls went to Hays to take on the Lady Indians. The Hays girls were too much, shutting them out in the first game 8-0 and edging the visitors 11-10 in the second.

Lauren Gray pitched the first game. The Indians got eight hits and eight runs off of her. She had five strike outs and eight walks.

The Cowgirls didn't have much to say in that game, as they hit only two singles and weren't able to get anyone home. Chelsea Gray and Ciara Abbey each hit a single.

In the second game, Aubrea Winter pitched. She got a pair of strikeouts and gave up seven walks, eight hits and 11 runs.

The team still got only singles, but this time it was nine. Singling were C. Gray, Winter, Melissa Swager, Justeen Koehler, Jordan Frazier, Tatum Schultz, Abbey, Morgan Titus (2) and Megan Rubio.

The trip to Colby April 25 was more fun, as the Cowgirls beat the Eagles 13-6 and 13-5.

Gray tossed the first game and this time struck out 10 while giving up nine walks, eight hits and six

runs.

May Davis had the only extra-base hit in the game with a double while C. Gray, Abbey, Megan Sheldon, Swager, L. Gray (2), Koehler (3), Frazier, Rubio, Schultz, Davis and Titus each got singles.

Winter took over the ball in the second game and had a pair of strikeouts and five walks. The Eagles had five runs on four hits off her.

The Cowgirls manufactured their 13 runs from walks and singles. Getting free rides were Abbey, Courtney Denies, Swager, Koehler (2), Rubio and Titus.

Singling were Frazier, Swager (2), Koehler, Schultz, Titus, Emily Burkett and Davis.

The last date of the month was in Ulysses, where the Cowgirls lost 11-10 and 17-16 to the Tigers. Titus hit a home run in the first game and Sheldon belted one in the second.

L. Gray again pitched the first game and gave up 11 hits and 11 runs. She had four strikeouts and eight walks.

She also hit a double and a pair of singles. C. Gray hit two doubles and Koehler hit three singles. Frazier and Abbey each hit a pair of singles and Titus and Davis added a single each to the tally. Swager was the only Cowgirl to get a walk.

Winter took over the mound in

the second game but was drilled for 15 hits and 17 runs by the Tigers. She had two strikeouts and gave up seven walks.

Swager got the only double for the Cowgirls. She also had three singles. C. Gray and Schultz each had a pair of singles and Koehler, L. Gray, Sheldon and Burkett each had a single.

The girls will be back in Hays on Wednesday this time at Thomas More Prep to take on the Monarchs, with the first game starting at 3 p.m.

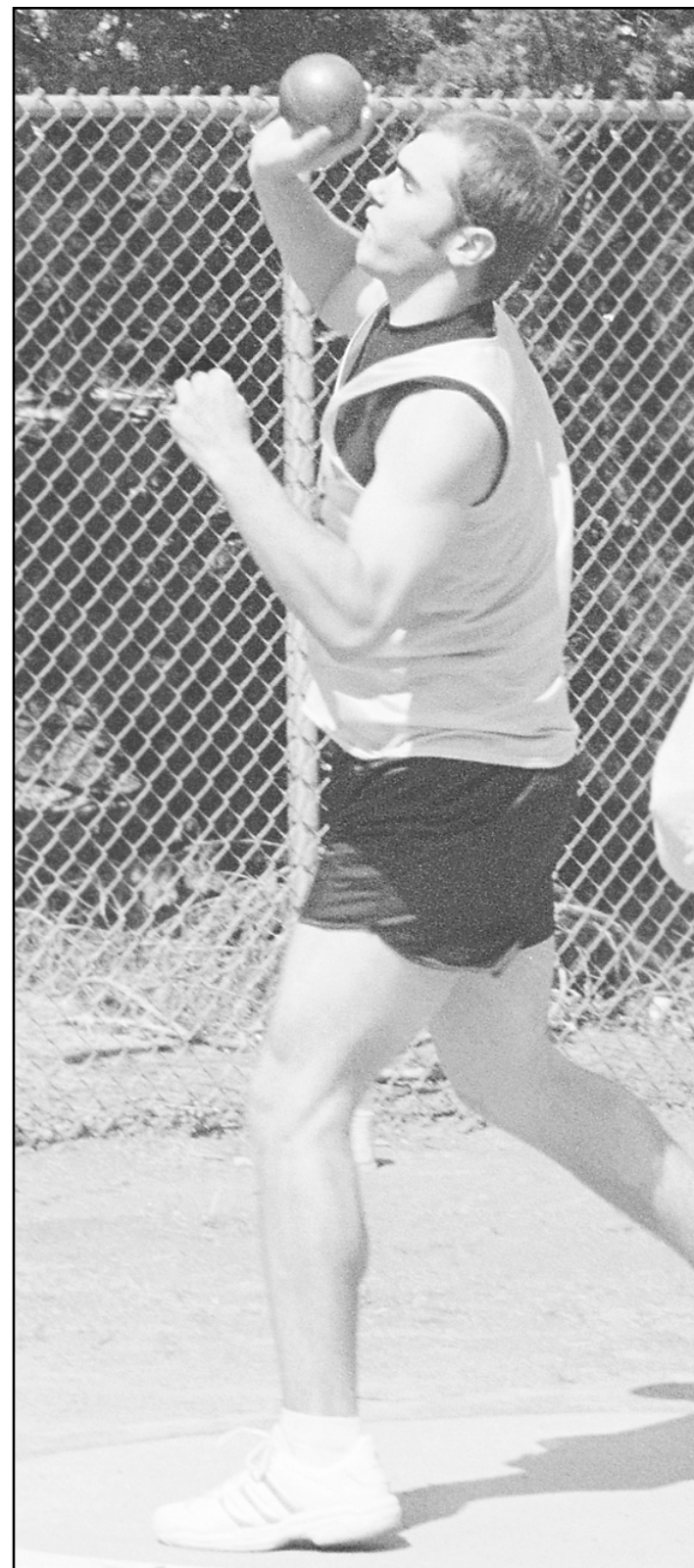
