**ORDINANCE NO. 1499
AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO UTILITY SERVICE FOR THE CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS, AND REPEALING AND AMENDING SECTIONS 17-210(2), 17-301(a)(1), 17-301(c), 17-315 AND 17-508 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND AS ADOPTED BY THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS, AND ADDING PROVISIONS TO CHAPTER 17 OF THE CODE OF CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 17-201(2) is amended to read as follows: Underground electric service. The property owner may request the city to install underground electric service to the service connection point. If the city agrees, the property owner shall be responsible for all

cost over and above the standard electric service drop provided by the city. All electric service at the Goodland Municipal Airport or electric service crossing Interstate Highway 70 shall be underground. Any person, firm, partnership or corporation leasing land at the airport or requesting electric service that requires the crossing of Interstate Highway 70 shall be required at their expense to install underground electric service requirements.

SECTION 2. Section 17-301(a)(1) is amended to read as follows:

Meter Charge:

One Inch (1")	\$ 2.00
Two Inch (2")	\$15.00
Three Inch (3")	\$30.00
Four Inch (4")	\$50.00

and One-Half Inch (1 1/2") \$ 7.00

SECTION 3. Section 17-301(c) is amended to read as follows: Each 100 gallons or part thereof: \$0.50.

SECTION 4. Section 17-315 is amended to read as follows: Mutilation of water property. No person shall remove, obstruct, alter, injure, damage or attempt to remove, obstruct, alter, injure, damage any fire hydrant, valve, valve box, valve cover, water meter, water meter box, water meter cover, or in any manner injure any building, machinery, or other appurtenances belonging to the water works system of the city, or carry off, or injure any pipe, tools, fixtures, apparatus, or property pertaining to the water works system of the city.

SECTION 5. Section 17-508 is amended to read as follows: In addition to any other conservation action enacted during a water supply emergency as provided in Section 17-505 of the Code of the City of Goodland, the governing body may enact an excess water use surcharge designed to conserve water supplies and shall be in addition to the established wa-

ter rates adopted by the City. Any excess water use surcharge shall be based upon cubic feet of water consumption as metered and in accordance with the following:

Phase I Excess Water Use Surcharge

Residential Customer (per 100 cubic feet or any part thereof):

5,001 to 10,000 cubic feet =	\$0.55
10,001 to 15,000 cubic feet =	\$1.55
15,001 and greater =	\$2.55

Phase II Excess Water Use Surcharge

Residential Customer (per 100 cubic feet or any part thereof):

2,501 to 5,000 cubic feet =	\$0.55
5,001 to 7,500 cubic feet =	\$1.55
7,501 and greater =	\$2.55

Commercial and Industrial Customer (per 100 cubic feet or any part thereof):

30,001 to 60,000 cubic feet =	\$0.55
60,001 and greater =	\$1.55

In case of extreme emergency, the governing body of the City of Goodland shall have the power to adopt by ordinance an additional excess water use surcharge on water consumption designed to conserve water supplies.

SECTION 6. The following provision is hereby added to and made a part of Chapter 17 of the Code of the City of Goodland, Kansas: Mutilation of electric service. No person shall remove, obstruct, alter injure, damage or attempt to remove, obstruct, alter injure, or damage any electric meter, transformer, conduit, wire, pole or any other appurtenances belonging to the electric system of the city.

SECTION 7. The following provision is hereby added to and made a part of Chapter 17 of the code of the City of Goodland, Kansas: Security Lighting. The property owner may request the city to install a security light or lights on the owner's property or public right-of-way through application to the city and payment of fees as required herein.

Upon approval of the application and payment of fees, the city will install and maintain the security light including any materials required to complete the installation. At any time fees are not paid when due, the city may remove or disconnect any security light.

The city reserves the

right to remove any security light for any reason it deems necessary and shall give property owner written notice of its intent and reason for doing so.

Fees for security lights shall be as follows:

100 watt light
\$ 7.00 per month or any part thereof.
250 watt light
\$14.00 per month or any part thereof.
1,000 – 1,500 watt light
\$32.00 per month or any part thereof.

SECTION 8. Sections 17-210(2), 17-301(a)(1), 17-301(c), 17-315 and 17-508 of the Code of the City of Goodland are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after publication in the official city newspaper

ORDINANCE NO. 1500

A SPECIAL ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE ASSESSMENT AND PAYMENT OF THE FUEL ADJUSTMENT CHARGE ASSOCIATED WITH THE APRIL 30, 2003 UTILITY BILL PAYABLE TO THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS AND EXPIRING AT 10:00 A.M., MDT, MAY 27, 2003.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Residential Customers with a fuel adjustment charge, pursuant to Section 17-208 of the Code of the City of Goodland, Kansas, of \$20.00 or less will be required to make full payment of the fuel adjustment charge on the April 30, 2003 utility bill in three equal monthly installments with no penalty or interest. Such arrangement must be made with the Utility Billing Department of the City of Goodland, Kansas. The first payment of the fuel adjustment charge will be due this April 30, 2003 billing period.

SECTION 2. Commer-

cial Customers with a fuel adjustment charge, pursuant to Section 17-208 of the Code of the City of Goodland, Kansas, of \$100.00 or less will be required to make full payment of the fuel adjustment charge on the April 30, 2003 utility bill in three equal monthly installments with no penalty or interest. Such arrangement must be made with the Utility Billing Department of the City of Goodland, Kansas. The first payment of the fuel adjustment charge will be due this April 30, 2003 billing period.

SECTION 3. Late payment penalties assessed for charges relating to utility charges billed on April 30, 2003 and due May 15, 2003 will be waived, however if payment arrangements for the fuel adjustment charge have not been made and payment is not received for the fuel adjustment or any other utility charges billed on April 30, 2003 on or before 10:00

A.M., MDT, May 27, 2003, utilities will be disconnected and all fees associated with reconnection of utilities as specified by City Code will be enforced.

SECTION 4. This special ordinance, with no further action by the Governing Body of the City of Goodland, Kansas, shall expire at 10:00 A.M., MDT, May 27, 2003.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after publication in the official city newspaper.
