## County to make trash hauler decision today; four firms interested

system, securing the trash from being blown around.

"We currently have rear load demolition containers, along with trucks that are designed to better handle construction debris," Butts said. "We feel it would be beneficial to offer the contractor a choice of container sizes. For example, a contractor tearing off shake shingles will be provided with an 8-yard container instead of three small side load containers."

"Our years of experience, not only in the solid waste industry, but public relations, will be beneficial in providing a dedicated and reliable service to the city of Goodland. For the most part, you will find this proposal is based on leaving the solid waste system as it currently is, thus minimizing any confusion or inconveniences to residents and commercial businesses. You will also find, based on past and current customers, that our service is dependable and trustworthy. Being natives to Goodland, we have a sincere interest in Goodland and its residents, and our business reflects our sincerity."

Butts' proposal is for a minimum lease of five years.

Included with the proposal was a letter from Kanorado Mayor Hazel Estes saving that Butts has been providing trash service to the city since 1992, and that his service has been good. There was a similar letter from Steve Boshoff about Butts' service to the Northern Sun plant for the past 10 years.

**Goodland Sanitation Services** Justin Comer's proposal would set up a company called Goodland Sanitation Services, and he differs from the others by planning to have

an individual roll-out cart furnished to each household for trash. waste system in the same manner and procedure as it is now.

Special pickups will be available on arrangements made by customers, and he has enclosed a list of charges for each type of item. Small appliances, non-metal furniture and carpet bundles would be \$3 each. Metal items and passenger tires would be \$5 each.

There would be a higher charge for larger tires, depending on the size

trash would be \$13.75 per month for one residential container, and an additional \$4 per month for a second.

Commercial would be \$25 per month for a 1-3 yard container, and \$15 for an additional container. There would be an additional charge of \$8 for more than one pickup per week.

The yard waste rates would be the same as they now are, with \$4 for the roll-out container and \$12 a month for a 3-cubic-yard container.

"This proposal is for a 10-year He would leave the current yard term which may not be canceled except for the material breach of duties by Goodland Sanitation Services," Comer's proposal said. "A discretionary termination may only be accomplished upon the payment to Goodland Sanitation Services of liquidated damages of \$100,000."

Included with Comer's proposal were a number of letters and comments from current customers to Haysville Sanitation Service which Comer has been operating.

'The City of Haysville was very pleased with the performance of Mr. Comer as a local businessman; and, in fact, contracted with his

Comer's rates for collecting the parks and the historic district," said a letter from the city signed by Carol C. Neugent, director of governmental services.

#### Waste Management

The fourth proposal is from Waste Management of Colorado Springs. This is not the same company that has been working with the city over the past year, but a similar company from the same city.

The proposal would set a monthly residential fee of \$12.50 which includes the current tipping fee, and is 75 cents less than the current monthly rate.

Commercial rates would be \$25.44 for a 3-yard container picked up once a week and that would go to \$122 for the same container picked up five times a week.

Waste Management has a extensive list of items that can be picked up on special arrangements, with charges ranging from \$1 for extra bags to \$30 for a sink, dryer of steel tub.

will "maintain public sites for the purpose of permitting residential disposal of small quantities of metal, construction and debris, which would alleviate residents delivering the same to the transfer station. The program and cost to customers or Sherman County will be determined at a later date."

Waste Management is proposing to purchase the three trucks and the 600 roll-out containers and 1,000 3vard containers for \$225,000.

"Waste Management is the largest environmental, refuse and recycling service in North America," said a cover letter from Alan Stevens district manager for Waste Management of Colorado. "We proudly service these fine clients: City of Monte Vista, Town of Simla, Town of Evans, Fort Carson Army base, Peterson Air Force base, U.S. Air Force Academy, U.S. Olympic Training Center, Oracle Corp., Shriever Air Force base, El Paso County and many others.

Waste Management is proud to submit the proposal to provide the trash collection for the city of Goodland."

The proposal says the company missioners had in their request for proposal and include handling special needs for commercial customers and for special events.

All four have indicated they would make use of the city garage for the trucks for at least the first year. Butts' proposal would be to reach an agreement with the city for use of the facility after the first year, or they would build their own building.

Comer's proposal indicates he would build a separate facility during the first year and not depend on using the city building for any longer than the a year.

Redlin's proposal indicates he will have a separate facility after the first year, as did Waste Management's.
