

League honors top grades

The Goodland High Cowboys and Cowgirls are not just good on the field. A bunch of them have been named to the first Northwest Kansas League All-Academic teams.

The league has released the names of student athletes with at least a 3.7 (A- or higher) grade point average on all teams in the league for the fall and winter sports.

The list, the first for the league, was compiled by Goodland High from figures submitted by all league members, said Principal Harvey Swager. He said Tammy Schoenthaler at the high school office crunched the numbers and put the list together.

In comparisons across the league, Goodland teams ranked well, led by girls basketball with an "A-" average of 3.6:

- Girls cross-country, second with a team grade point average of 3.36.
- Boys cross-country, second, 3.39.
- Boys Basketball, fourth, 3.27.
- Girls basketball, fifth, 3.6.
- Volleyball, fifth, 3.4.
- Wrestling, sixth, 2.96.
- Football, seventh, 3.03.

There are eight schools in the league — Goodland, Hoxie, Colby, Quinter, Oakley, Oberlin, Atwood and St. Francis.

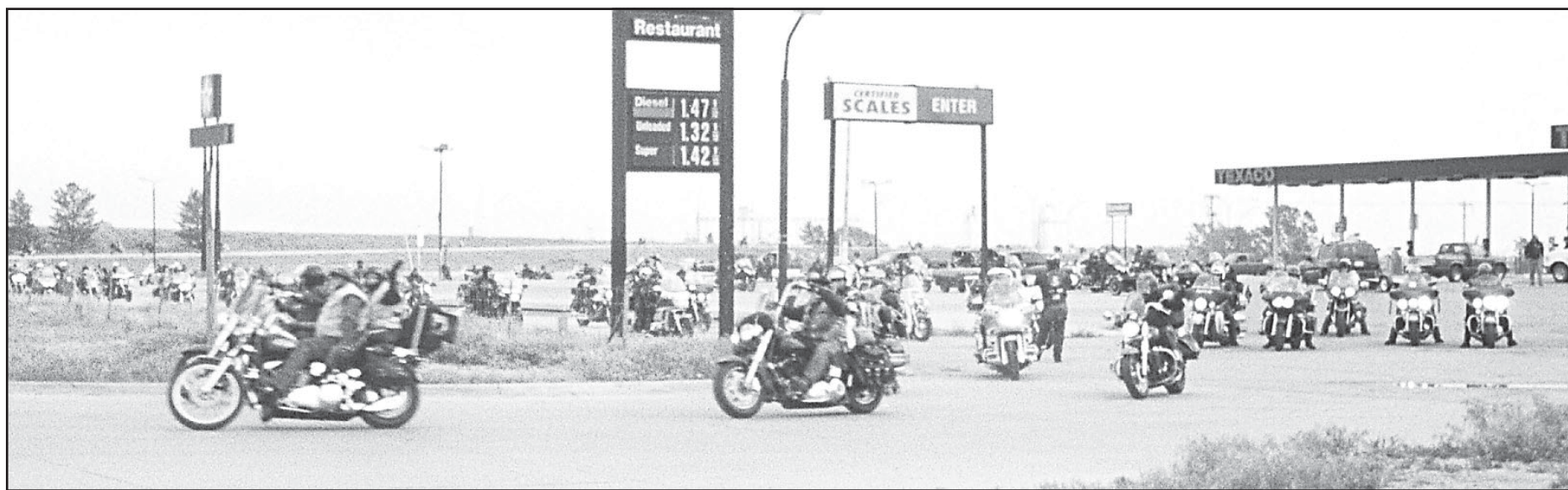

Cowgirls, Boys take second at league track meet

Goodland High athletes took second place for boys and for girls at the Northwest Kansas League meet in Oberlin on Friday.

Colby won the girls' portion on the meet with 124 points while the Cowgirls had 95. Oakley won the boys' meet with 136 points and Goodland had 108.

Aaron Gittinger and Taylor Brack won first places for the boys while Jayci Stone and Alisha McKee took top prizes for the girls.

The girls put together a 4X100-meter relay team, which took second.

The regional meet will be in Scott City on Friday.
