The Goodland High team has six girls and seven boys heading for the state meet in Wichita on Saturday after some blazing performances at the Class 4A Regional Track Meet in Scott City on Friday.

The boys finished a respectable eighth out of 16 teams and the girls staked out third place as a team.

The top four placers in each event at regionals get a trip to state. The boys placed in nine events and the girls in 11.

Jayci Stone was the star of the meet for Goodland, taking the teams' only two first places—in the high jump and the pole vault. She was also part of the 4x100-meter relay team which is state-bound.

Also heading for state from the Goodland girls team are Rebecca Gattshall, 100-meter dash and 4x100-meter relay; Kendra Billinger, 3,200-meter run; Alisha McKee, shot put and 4x100-meter relay; Jessica Osborn javelin; and Whitney Carmichael, 4x100-meter relay.

Heading for state for the boys are Dan Melia, 110 and 300-meter hurdles; Lance Tedford, long jump; Bret Jarmin, javelin; Aaron Gittinger, 800-meter run and 4x800-meter relay; and Speedy Aguilar, Jared Doke and Daniel Blake, 4x800-meter relay.
