Golfer shoots 79, off to state

Sophomore Derrick Raymer led the Goodland Cowboys in the Class 4A Regional meet at Park Hills County Club in Pratt last Monday, May 19, winning a trip to the state tournament.

Raymer was the only Goodland player to finish at the top of the pack, coming in fourth by shooting a 79. The Cowboys team finished third.

Colby's D. Wieland led all players with a 75, followed by A. Dees, Ulysses, 77; C. Finley, Colby, 78; Raymer, 79; J. Helin, Colby, 79; H. Smith, Nickerson, 80; B. Karlin, Hugoton, 80; T. Swartzendruber, Kingman, 80; T. Eisenhauer, Pratt, 81; and B. Parsons, Kingman, 82.

With three men in the top 10, Colby won the tournament with a 316. Ulysses came in second with 330 and Goodland third with 341.

Also playing in the tournament, but placing no one in the top 10, were Scott City, Nickerson, Larned and Chaparral.

Cowgirls sweep three, bound for state

The Goodland High softball team is headed for the state tournament after defeating Colby, 16-11; Scott City, 11-1; and Pratt, 4-0, in the regional playoffs in Hugoton last Wednesday.

Britany Pettibone pitched all three games. She struck out four Colby players, walked one and gave up nine hits and 11 runs to the Eagles. She had four strikeouts against Scott City, walked no one and gave up only seven hits and a single run.

In the championship game, Pettibone pitched a three-hit shut-out. She struck out seven, gave up no walks allowed the Pratt Greenbacks just three hits.

"We played a great game," Coach Terry Daise said of the championship round. "We beat a good Pratt

team with solid pitching and defense."

Shanae Calkins and Tomi Windell hit homers for the Cowgirls, both in the game against Scott City.

With a total of 27 runs in the first game, against Colby, there was someone on base almost all the time.

Hitting for the Cowgirls were Stephanie Fairbanks, a pair of doubles; Pettibone, one double; Alissa Schields, a single and a walk; Calkins, two doubles, two singles and a walk; Adrienne Garcia, a single; Colleen Koehler, a single; Windell, a triple and a single; and Tammy Weeter, a double and a single.

While Scott City didn't see many base runners in the second game,

Scott City Boys won the regional competition with 96 points. Mulvane was second with 67 and Andale third with 63. Goodland had 36.

The girls competition was won by Colby with 89 points, followed by Hugoton with 69. Goodland came in third with 50.
