June 6, 1903: More Trouble for J.B. Moore — J.B. Moore of McPherson township was in Goodland with a very sore wrist. Not long ago, Jim made a hard fight with measles.

He recovered from the disease all right, but was not strong enough to stand the rough weather which has been holding Sherman County in its grip of late.

He recently exposed himself to the cold night air and was taken with chills and fever before he returned home.

Subsequently an ugly looking

patch of inflammation appeared on his wrist which occasioned much pain. The doctor pronounced it a kind of erysipelas.

Jim has had his share of trouble for a while, and now it is about time for all diseases of the flesh to leave him alone and give him a new lease on life. Let it be hoped they will.

June 7, 1903: Ed Fender, the Rhine merchant, has sold out his stock of goods to Mr. LeBar, a farmer living in the neighborhood of Rhine. Mr. Fender also turned

over to the purchaser of the Continental Creamery company's skimming station at that place, which position Mr. Fender has held for several years.

June 8, 1903: A Challenge — We, the court house gang, hereby challenge the business men of Goodland to a game of baseball in the near future, the date to be decided upon by the men concerned.

We think we can run rings around you businessmen in the matter of baseball but are itching to prove our assertion. Now if you have any sand, come forward like men.

June 9, 1903: Donly & Scott, Grocers, Now Located in the Large Scyler Brick. — This gives the firm one of the finest business fronts in the city. The large wall space provides ample room for arranging and displaying of their goods.

The room is provided with large

plate glass windows, embossed metallic ceiling and rich colored paper for the sides. Messrs. Donly & Scott are much pleased with their new place and are taking much pains to make the room as attractive as possible.
