

# Goodland wins at home

## Tournament raises funds for graduation

The Goodland Elite 8, seventh to eighth grade girls basketball team, won its home Mid America Youth Basketball tournament Saturday. The tournament raised about \$5,000 for Project Graduation 2005.

The Elite 8 played the Northwest Kansas Sparks from Colby at 11 a.m. in the high school gym and won 31-29 in the team's only close game.

The team beat the Dundy County, Neb., Gymrats 67-15 in the 1 p.m. game at Edson, the Burlington I seventh grade team 75-18 in the junior high gym at 4 p.m., the Burlington II eighth grade team 50-17 in the Max Jones Fieldhouse at 6 p.m. and the St. Francis team 44-15 in the fieldhouse at 8 p.m.

The Goodland team beat the Colby team 52-20 Sunday for first place among seventh to eighth grade girls teams at the tournament. Thirty-five teams, including boys and girls teams, competed in the tournament.

There were six teams going on to the championships for each division, sixth grade through high school girls and 6-7th grade through 11-12th grade boys with the first and second seeds playing for first and second place, the third and fourth for third and fourth places and the fifth and sixth seeds for fifth and sixth places.

Event Organizer Dana Murray said the money raised by the tournament has not all been counted but estimates that about \$5,000 was raised.

The event was a success, she said, as there was a lot of positive feedback from everybody and no complaints.

A lot of people helped, Murray said, stepping up to take charge. Murray said Goodland will host another tournament next year.

# K-18 splits pair of double headers

Thursday, rain permitting, the team was to be in Oberlin. Monday they will be hosting Oakley with the first game starting at 6 p.m.

Andrew Pettibone pitched three innings of the first game at Imperial and Brandon Hatfield pitched two innings.

Brandon Zelfer had a solo home run in the first inning, and Mark Starr scored the second run after stealing second base and a single by Derek Fenner.

Goodland added two runs in the third, three in the fourth and exploded in the sixth with six runs.

Goodland had 12 hits in the game. Imperial had 13 hits.

The score was tied 2-2 after the first inning and Imperial was leading 7-4 in the third inning. Goodland tied the score in the fourth innings and outscored Imperial 6-1 in the final inning to win 13-8.

In the second game Goodland's TJ Hawkins pitched the first inning, but Imperial led 7-3. Hawkins gave up four hits in the first inning including a double, a triple and two singles.

Zelfer pitched the next four innings giving up four runs and five hits.

Goodland managed to add a run in the fifth inning to make the final 10-4. Goodland had 10 hits including at double and a triple in the fifth by Starr and Hawkins to score the final run. Imperial had 9 hits.

Monday Tadd Taylor started the game against Hoxie as the

Goodland pitcher, but was replaced by Hatfield after one out.

Hoxie was leading 5-3 after the first inning. They added seven runs in the third to lead 12-3. Came back in the fourth with four runs, one in the fifth and three in the eighth to make it close. Hoxie added a run in the fifth. The final score was 13-11 with Hoxie winning.

Goodland had 11 hits and Hoxie had 13 hits.

In the second game Bobby Miller pitched the first 3 and 1/3 innings and was relieved by Zelfer.

Goodland jumped out to a 6-1 lead in the first inning. Goodland outscored Hoxie 6-4 in the second inning the make it a 12-5 game. Goodland added a run in the third and one in the fourth for their 14 runs. Hoxie tried to mount a comeback in the fifth with four runs to make the final 14-9.

Goodland had 11 hits, Hoxie had six hits including one home run.

# Strong-armed kids go to Missouri

Two Goodand kids are in Platte City, Mo., today participating in the Amateur Athletic Union Missouri Valley track meet.

Michelle Smith and Nick Smith qualified by participating in the area meet in Colby on June 7 and the state meet in Manhattan on Saturday.

Four Goodland kids participated in the Amateur Athletic Union Track meet held at Colby June 7, and qualified to compete in the Kansas State meet held in Manhattan Friday and Saturday.

At the Colby meet Hope Cochran, 8, placed first in the primary girls 100 meter with a time of 18.47. Sub-bantam boys Nathaniel Smith, 9, placed third in the long jump with a jump of 8 feet 2 inches and 5th in the shot put with a distance of 10 feet 11 1/2 inches.

In the midget girls heat Michelle Smith, 12, placed first in the shot put with a distance of 32 feet 2 inches,

and second place in discus with a throw of 87 feet.

Youth boys 13 and 14 year old heat Nick Smith placed first in both the discus and shot put, with a throw of 93 feet 9 inches and a put of 38 feet 1 1/2 inches.

Dustin Pennington placed second in the hundred meter hurdles with a time of 21.71, had a long jump of 12 feet 11 1/2 inches to clench the second place position. He was second in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:51.12. Pennington ran the 1500 meter race with a time of 5:44.40 to earn him a third place victory.

The top six in each event qualified to go to Kansas State meet in Manhattan.

The state results had Hope Cochran place 10th in the 100 meter race with a time of 18.92.

Nathaniel Smith placed seventh in the shot-put by a distance of 14 feet 9 1/2 inches. Smith placed tenth in the long jump with the distance

of 7 feet 9 3/4 inches.

Michelle Smith placed first in the shot put with a distance of 33 feet 1/2 inches. She placed second in the discus with a throw of 90 feet, up three feet from the Colby meet.

Nick Smith placed first in the shot put in the 13-14 year old heat with a distance of 35 feet 10 1/2 inches. While placing fifth in the discus with a throw of 77 feet 10 3/4 inches.

While Dustin Pennington placed eighth in the 100 meter hurdles with a time of 21.21. He also placed eighth in the long jump by getting a 13 feet 0 inch jump. In the 1500 meter run Pennington placed 11th with a time of 5:47.92 and in the 800 meter run he ran a race of 2:49.89 seconds to place him in 15th.

Michelle Smith and Nick Smith qualified for the Missouri Valley Meet in Platte City, Mo. being held today and Saturday.
