Legion team whips Imperial 19-3; record is 2-2

The Goodland American Legion baseball team traveled to Imperial, Neb., on Monday and came away with a 19-3 win, which gives the team a 2-2 record.

Liz West, team manager, said the weather has played havoc with the schedule.

“We would have played 10 games by now,” she said, “but with the rains we have only been able to

get in four. We couldn’t play the second game Monday at Imperial because of the weather.”

The Legion team will host the Levi Hayden Memorial Tournament on Saturday and Sunday in Goodland.

Goodland opens tournament play at 9 a.m. Saturday, when they face Calhan, Colo. At 11 a.m., it will be Ellis vs. Wray, Colo.; at 1:30 p.m.,

Academy Charter vs. Calhan; 3:30 p.m. Goodland vs. Ellis; and 6 p.m., Wray vs. Academy Charter.

Sunday, the games start at 8 a.m. with Academy Charter vs. Ellis; 10 a.m. Wray vs. Goodland; 12:30 p.m. Ellis vs. Calhan; 2:30 p.m. Goodland vs. Academy Charter; and 5 p.m. Calhan vs. Wray.

Proceeds from the tournament are used for the Levi Hayden Memorial Scholarship, given to a Goodland American Legion senior baseball player.

At Imperial, Matt Kuhlman pitched through part of the seventh inning, and hit two home runs in the

seventh to help get the 19-3 win.

Goodland took a 3-2 lead in the second inning, and added runs in every inning. They added one in the third, one in the fourth, three in the fifth, three in the sixth and exploded

for eight runs in the seventh.

Brock Lohr relieved Kuhlman part way through the seventh and finished the game.

Imperial got two runs in the first and added one in the fifth.

Goodland K-18 splits pair with Oakley

The Goodland K-18 baseball team ran its record to 14-4 Monday when they split a doubleheader with Oakley, losing the first game 6-4 and winning the second, 19-9.

The games with Oakley were the first of three home appearances for the K-18 team. They hosted Quinter on Thursday and will host Atwood at 6 p.m. on Monday.

In the first game against Oakley, Brandon Hatfield pitched four innings, striking out eight and giving up six walks. Bobby Miller came in to pitch two innings. He struck out four with two walks.

Goodland had a 4-0 lead after the first inning on base hits by Brett Lalicker and Hatfield. They were followed by Brandon Zelfer, who had a triple. Mark Starr had a base hit to score Zelfer. T.J. Hawkins had a single and then stole second. He

scored on a double by Torrey Elder. Tadd Taylor had a single in the inning.

Goodland was unable to score again and managed only three hits in the next five innings. Zelfer had a double in the second and Derek Fenner had a single.

Starr and Elder each had a single in the fourth inning, and Andrew Pettibone had a single in the fifth inning.

Zelfer pitched the second game, striking out 10 and giving up five walks.

Oakley took a 4-1 lead in the first inning, but Goodland kept them from scoring again until the fourth, when they added a run. They got two in the fifth.

Goodland’s first run came when Hatfield walked and stole second base and then stole third. He came

into score on a base hit by Zelfer.

Goodland exploded for seven runs in the third inning to take the lead, 7-4. Lalicker started with a base hit. Zelfer had a ground-rule double. Fenner had a single, and then Miller and Taylor had back to back doubles. Lalicker finished off the slug fest with a triple.

The team kept the scoring going in the fourth, adding six runs, and five more in the fifth for the 19-9 win.

Zelfer and Hawkins had base hits in the fourth, Taylor had a double and Starr had a triple.

Lalicker, Hatfield and Fenner had base hits in the fifth inning, and Zelfer had a double to finish the Goodland hitting.

Goodland had 13 hits in the game while Oakley had four.
