The Goodland K-18 baseball eam raised its record to 15-5 Thursday when the boys split a home doubleheader with Quinter, losing the first game 8-2 and winning the second 9-5.

Today the team begins a road trip, traveling to St. Francis for a doubleheader beginning at 6 p.m. Mountain Time. On Monday, they will be in Colby and next Wednesday in Hoxie. Those games will begin at 5:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

The sub-regional tournament will be held in Colby on Friday-Sunday, July 11-13. Goodland will host the regional tournament the weekend of July 18-20, and the state tournament will be at Lucas on July 27 - 30

Against Quinter, Goodland took an early 2-1 lead in the first game behind the pitching of Andrew Pettibone, who threw 4 1/3 innings before Torrey Elder came in for the final 1 2/3 inning.

Brett Lalicker got things started when he tried to stretch a triple into a home run, but was out at home. Brandon Hatfield followed with a single and stole second. Brandon Zelfer was hit by a pitch, moved to second on a single by Mark Starr and then Zelfer stole third. Hatfield scored on Starr's single, and Zelfer scored on a single by Derek Fenner.

Lalicker had a single in the second, a single in the fourth and a double in the sixth, but Goodland could not put together a score.

Starr had another single in the third. Goodland loaded the bases, but was unable to score. Fenner had a triple in the fifth, but he was

stranded at third.

Elder tried to help with a base hit in the sixth followed by the double by Lalicker, but they were stranded on base.

Quinter tied the game in the third inning at 2-2, and then broke it open in the fifth, scoring six runs.

Quinter had 11 hits, Goodland 10. In the second game. Quinter took an early 4-0 lead. Bobby Miller started for Goodland, but Brandon Hatfield relieved him after one out. Miller had one strike out, but gave up four walks and hit two batters to walk in the first three Ouinter runs.
