## Junior golfers come to Goodland

 Area golfers had a good day as Goodland took its turn last Monday hosting the Northwest Kansas Junior Golf Tournament.

A total of 68 golfers from eight to 17 turned out, and Goodland had 35 participants.

Tyler Jones and Joel Linin from Goodland took the first and second place slots of the 8-9 year old boys. Jones came in with a score of 67 while Linin scored 69. Rounding out the top three was Kaid Wark of Colby at 78.

Girls top spot went to Kaylee Keck of Colby at 96. Also from

Colby was Julia Hutfles, scoring 101 to put her into second place.

In the 10-11 year old group, Goodland girls Chelsie Gausman and Amber Douglas placed in the top two slots with scores of 65 and 66. Third went to Emily Chessmere of Atwood with 75.

Boys winner was Zack Ruda of Atwood with a score of 41 taking first. Second place went to Ryley Haas of Colby with a 43. Placing third after a playoff was Taylor Moeder from Colby at 48.

In the 12-13 year old boys top three were all from Goodland, Nathan Linin took the top spot with a 44. Just a stroke behind was Jance

McKee at 45. In third, T.J. Hawkins, scoring 53.

On the girls side, the top three scores were from Samantha Raymer of Goodland shooting a 56 and Jessie Curtin of Atwood placed second scoring 78. In third was April Chessmere of Atwood at 91.

Goodland's Julie Leiker was the only 14-15 year old girl competing, an she shot a 144 over 18 holes. On the boys side, Andrew Fikan of Atwood scored 80. Ten strokes behind in third place was Brett Rummel, also from Atwood at 90. Goodland got third place with Ryan Gausman scoring 98.

In the 16-17 year old age group, the top three women, all from Goodland, were Kayla Rasure, Kelsey Leiker and Emily Burkett, scoring 100, 145 and 151 respectively. The top boys were all from Colby. First went to Sean Mengel with 93 followed by Jared Helin with 96 and Jordon Cranston at 97. The next tournament site will be Norton on Monday, July 7.
