K-18 destroys Hoxie on the road

Goodland will be seeded No. 3 in the regional K-18 baseball tournament to be played at Goodland's Memorial Field over the weekend.

Hoxie hosted a double header with Goodland on the July 9. Andrew Pettibone pitched five innings with seven strikeouts and five walks. Tadd Taylor pitched as the closer with one strikeout and two hits.

Goodland started off first game strong with six runs in the first. Derek Fenner hit a triple, Sean Vliem and Brandon Zelfer hit doubles and singles came from Brandon Hatfield, Mark Starr, Taylor, Tyler Hillmer and Brett Lalicker.

In the third, Taylor walked and then stole second. Hillmer doubled to bring in Taylor and pick up an RBI.

In the fourth inning, Vliem hit a triple to bring up Pettibone, who walked, then stole second as Vliem ran for home.

Zelfer hit a triple in the fifth. Then Starr hit a single to bring in Zelfer, picking up an RBI. He then stole second. Taylor also singled and stole second in the fifth.

In the sixth, Zelfer walked and stole second, with Hatfield singling and stealing second to pick up an RBI with Zelfer scoring.

A double was hit by Zelfer, who also picked up an RBI. Fenner hit a single. Then Taylor hit a double, and Hillmer sacrificed to left field to bring in the last RBI of the game.

Game 2 against Hoxie went only two innings, with Hoxie deciding to call the game after Goodland scored 19 runs.

Zelfer hit an in-the-park grand slam in the second. Another in-the-park home run was hit by Fenner.

The team played in the Sub-Regional tournament in Colby on Saturday. Goodland played the hosting team first and lost 6-4. Hatfield pitched, giving up nine hits, five walks and two strikeouts.

The second inning brought three runs in for Goodland. T.J. Hawkins

singled and then told second, getting to third on a passed ball. Hillmer singled to pick up and RBI bringing in Hawkins. Starr singled with Taylor and Pettibone both walking. Pettibone got an RBI for Starr coming in.

The last run of the game came in the fourth to end the game.

Goodland's last game of the tournament in Colby was against Quinter. Zelfer pitched and had 12 strikeouts, six hits and one walk.

The team scored three runs in the first. Lalicker walked and stole second, then got to third on an error. That brought up, Hatfield who walked and picked up an RBI for Lalicker. Zelfer also walked along

with Hawkins and Hillmer.

The fourth was Goodland's big inning, with nine runs coming in. Hatfield stole two bases after getting on from a walk. Then Zelfer singled and also stole two bases, then stole home. Hawkins walked and then he also stole second. Hawkins advanced to third after Hillmer was walked. Starr and Torrey Elder both singled with a walk from Pettibone. Hatfield singled and got two RBI's. This gave Goodland a 12-4 win.

Goodland placed third overall in the tournament and will go on to the regional this weekend. Seven teams from the East Division are expected to play in the tournament.

Legion splits with Colby

Goodland's American Legion baseball squad split a double header against Colby on Sunday.

Brock Lohr pitched three innings in the first game, recording one strikeout, six walks and five hits. Then at the top of the fourth, Kevin Schulte came in to pitch with one strikeout, giving up three walks and five hits.

In the first, Landon West hit a home run. Then in the third, Jake Alander singled to first and stole two bases to set up another score.

In the fourth, Brett Ross advanced to third on errors from Colby's first and third basemen and the shortstop.

Ross scored on Kyle Schulte's base hit. The last run of the game came in the sixth off an error by Colby's shortstop. Goodland lost the game with the final score 14-5.

The win in game 2 came with Matt Kuhlman pitching three and a half innings with four walks, five hits and three strikeouts. West came in to pitch, finishing the game with three walks, four hits and six strikeouts.

single.

The third brought in four runs. Three scored on errors and a triple from Kyle Schulte.

One run scored in the fifth from a single by West. In the sixth, Jared Dokes got on with a walk and later scored from an error.

The final inning of the game brought the final five runs on a single by West with one RBI, a single from Lohr with two RBI's and a triple from Derek Fenner to bring in the last two, bringing the score to a 15-14 win.

Goodland will host Imperial, Neb., at 6 p.m. today at Memorial Field.
