NOTICE TO PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS OF NONSEGREGATED FACILITIES. The successful bidder will be required to submit a Certification of Non-segregated Facilities and to notify prospective subcontractors of the requirement for such a certification where the subcontract exceeds \$10,000.

In accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act, as amended, the Contractor will be required to comply with the wage and labor requirements and to pay minimum wages in accordance with the schedule of wage rates established by the United States Department of Labor.

The requirements of 49 CFR Part 26, Regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation, apply to this contract. It is the policy of the City of Goodland to practice nondiscrimination based on race, color, sex or national origin in the award or performance of this contract. All firms qualifying under this solicitation are encouraged to submit bids/proposals. Award of this contract will be conditioned upon satisfying the requirements of this section. These requirements apply to all bidders/offerors, including those who qualify as a DBE. AD BE contract goal of 9.27 percent has been established for this contract. The bidder/offeror shall make good faith efforts, as defined in Appendix A, 49 CFR Part 26, to subcontract 9.27 percent of the dollar value of the prime contract to disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE), as defined in 49 CFR Part 26.

For bidders/offerors and subcontractors who qualify as a DBE, any work subcontracted to a non-DBE contractor must be subtracted from the overall DBE participation amount counted toward meeting, the DBE goal, as detailed in 49 CFR Part 26.55

The apparent successful competitor will be required to submit the following information: (1) the names and addresses of DBE firms that will participate in the contract; (2) a description of the work that each DBE firm will perform, (3) the dollar amount of the participation of each DBE firm participating, (4) Written documentation of the bidder/offeror's commitment to use a DBE subcontractor whose participation it submits to meet the contract goal; (5) Written confirmation from the DBE that it is participating in the contract as provided in the commitment made under (4); and (6) if the contract goal is not met, evidence of good faith efforts, as described in 49 CFR Part 26.
