Sherman County Historical Society July 30, 1903: Almost Another Fire—Lightning Burns Telephone in Bower's Furniture Store — During the terrific thunder shower a bolt of lightning struck the wire leading to the telephone box in the Bower Furniture store and very nearly started a fire that might have again destroyed the Leonard Brick.

It was about midnight when it happened and no one was near who could have extinguished the fire should it have started.

When Hugh Elliot, an employee of the store, unlocked the door in the morning and walked to the rear of the store, he noticed that the telephone box was wrecked.

The door of the box was burst open and one of the battery cells displaced and lay upon the floor. The receiver was torn off and lay upon the floor.

and it developed that the gun had been paid for in stamps, and the order in the boy's own handwriting was secured.

Upon this evidence, young Dice was arrested by United States Marshal McGrath and finally was persuaded to tell all about the burglary. All the while he had represented to his parents that he found the stamps.

He was taken to Leavenworth and will be brought before the United States Circuit Court, and in all probability will be sent to the reform school.

The Dice family are well and favorably known, and it is a matter of regret that the family name should suffer injury from the misdemeanor of the boy.
