

Quilts to adorn arts center

A Goodland quilting group will display this month at the Carnegie Arts Center 13 quilts born out of the events of Sept. 11, 2001, and patriotic quilts from Sherman County and the surrounding area.

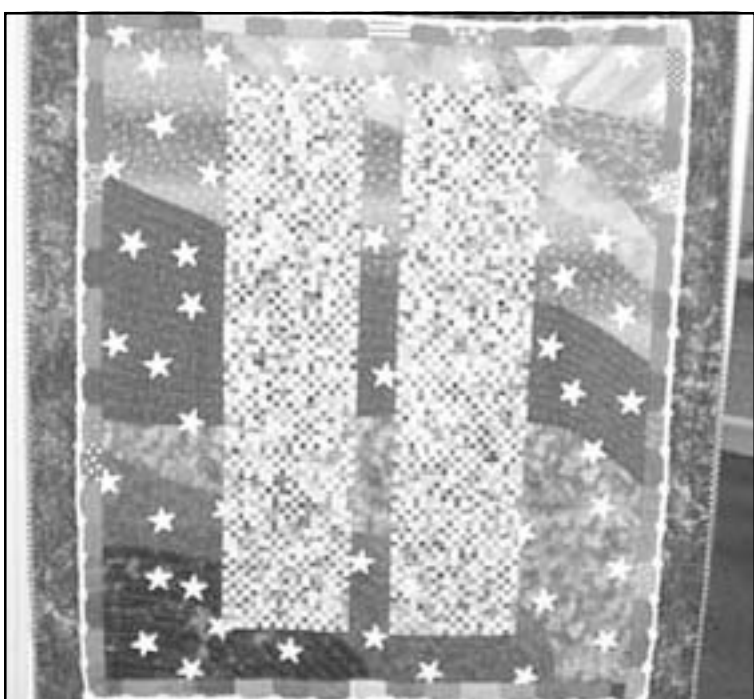
The Prairie Piecemakers are sponsoring "The American Spirit Quilt Collection," compiled by the Quilt Heritage Foundation of Omaha at the Carnegie Arts Center for a show from Friday-Sunday, Aug. 15-17. The art center, 120 W. 12th, will be open extended hours for the show: 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Saturday and from 1-4 p.m. Sunday.

Reacting to the events of Sept. 11 the way quilters have responded for generations, the foundation organized a campaign to generate the creation of quilts. The group said quilters would feel a need to do something to help.

"Like our mothers and grandmothers before us," the press release said, "we reacted to the awful events that unfolded before our eyes with a desire to comfort the hurt with a quilt."

"We know that a quilt cannot replace the loss, but it is a tangible sign to the world that we care passionately."

The foundation encouraged

quilters to create quilts that "reflect the American spirit and that will inspire the world." Thousands of quilts were donated to families of victims; thousands more were made to honor the heroes.

Other quilts were made to use as donation quilts to raise money for relief agencies that were working with the victims. A handful of the quilts are in the traveling display that will be in Goodland.

Among the quilts in the display is "Ground Zero" by Lois Jarvis, a quilting instructor at the Madison, Wis., Area Technical College. Jarvis used the Lone Star pattern for

the quilt to create an explosion with outward movement.

She downloaded over 1,000 pictures of Sept. 11 victims from CNN, printed about 800 and used just over 700 for the quilt.

"9.11.2001," by Claire Koelzer Gardner, was done with nine blue fabrics for the ninth month. The twin towers stand in formation as an 11 on the quilt and are done in 3,000 different fabrics, representing each person who died at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and on the airplanes.

In the sky, pearl buttons spell 2001 in Braille.

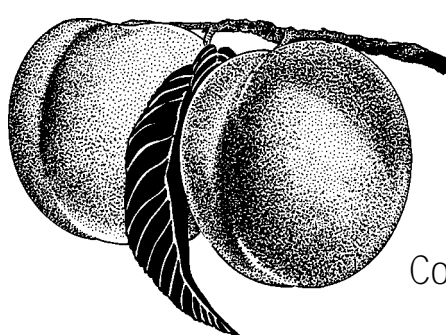

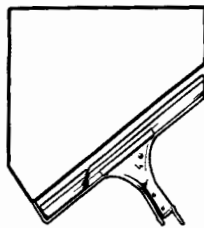

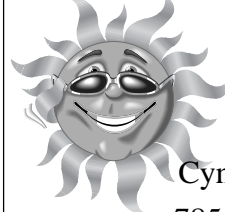
