Sherman County Historical Society August 12, 1903: The telegraph operators of the Rock Island, who not long ago asked for a nine-hour day instead of ten, and also an increase of wages amounting to ten per cent of their monthly salary, have been granted their demands, preventing a strike.

August 13, 1903: "Kansas New Game Law — It shall be unlawful for any person or persons at any time, except as hereinafter provided, to hunt, catch, kill, pursue, entrap, ensnare any partridge, grouse, prairie chicken, quail, plover, pheasant, oriole, meadowlark, thrush, robin, red bird, mocking bird, blue jay, blue bird, wild duck, wild geese and wild brant (goose);
