In partnership with ReCellular Inc., donated phones will generate money needed to support research into the causes of premature birth. education to help women have healthy babies and assistance for health care providers in identifying women at risk for premature birth.

Premature birth is the leading cause of newborn death in the United States, affecting more than 476.000 babies each year.

Babies born prematurely who survive can have lifelong consequences such as blindness or mental retardation.

Nearly half of all premature births happen for unknown reasons. The March of Dimes is looking for the answers.

"The cell phone donation program is such an easy way to help save babies," said Carlene Schweer, Garden City division director.

"Just gather up the phones you, your friends and family and your co-workers aren't using and bring them to the March of Dimes," she said. "There's even a collection kit for your office, club or church."
