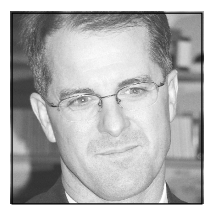


# 3-day right to cancel won't apply at state fair

Dear Attorney General Kline:

I recently spoke with a friend of mine who will be selling hand-made crafts at a booth at the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson. In the course of our conversation, she mentioned that the three-day right to cancel does not apply to sales made at the State Fair. I thought the three-day right to cancel applied to any sale made away from the seller's place of business, including as a door-to-door sales and county fairs. What does the law say about the right to cancel state fair sales?

loop-hole (so your friend does not need to comply), as do purchases under \$25, goods or services not meant for personal or household use (like educational courses), or sales involving real estate, stocks and bonds, or cars. Sales that are made solely through the mail or by telephone are exempt from the federal rule as well.

If you sign a contract with the vendor that gives you a buyer's right to cancel within three days, you would still have that contractual right to cancel the transaction. You'll want to make sure the any contracts you enter into at the fair contain such language for your protection.

It is always important to consider your decision to make a purchase carefully and to avoid buying anything on a whim, as it is far easier to simply avoid a purchase you'll regret rather than going through the time, expense, and trouble or trying to return items purchased at a temporary location.

However, the Federal Trade Commission still enforces a national three-day "cooling off rule" for goods that are sold at the buyer's home, workplace or dormitory, or at facilities rented by the seller on a temporary or short-term basis, which would apply to the state fair.

Under the federal rule, a seller must inform you of your cancellation rights and provide you with copies of a cancellation form along with your receipt. In order to cancel the sale under the federal rule, you must fill out the form and mail it within three business days (Saturday counts, Sunday and holidays do not) to the address on the form. The seller then has 10 days to refund your money and another 10 to pick the item up. Of course, you must return the item in the same condition in which it was purchased. You do not need a reason to cancel the purchase, but you will need to make the goods available for pickup or mail them if the seller pays for postage.

However, there are certain types of sales that do not fall under the federal rule, either and may not be able to be canceled even if they occur in a location that might otherwise qualify under state or federal law. Arts and crafts fall under this

a shallow baking dish and season with salt, pepper, olive oil, garlic and dill. Arrange the red pepper on top. Bake for 15 minutes. Serve with fresh lemon juice squeezed on top. Serves 6.

**Pita Bread**

1 1/2 cup lukewarm water  
1 tablespoon active dry yeast  
2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil  
1 teaspoon salt  
3 1/2 cups all purpose flour  
Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a medium bowl combine lukewarm water with olive oil, salt, yeast and stir to dissolve. Add half of the flour to the yeast mixture and beat with a mixer for 1 minute. Add the remaining flour and knead into soft dough. Let dough rise in warm place for 30 minutes and transfer to a floured surface.

Divide dough into eight portions and roll each piece into a circle 9 inches in diameter. Placed formed pita on a lightly greased baking sheet, cover and let it rise again for 10 minutes. Bake in the preheated oven for 5 minutes. Serves 8.

**Stuffed Grape Leaves**

1 cup white converted rice  
3 cups water  
1/2 cup fresh squeezed lemon juice  
1 teaspoon salt.  
1/2 cup olive oil  
2 cups finely chopped fresh tomatoes  
1 cup finely chopped parsley  
1 cup finely chopped green onion  
1/2 cup finely chopped fresh mint  
1/2 cup finely chopped fresh dill  
1/4 teaspoon black pepper  
1 16 ounce jar grape leaves  
2 cups water  
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium size saucepan, cook the

rice in 3 cups of water over low heat for minutes. (Do not use minute rice) In a large bowl combine the cooked rice, olive oil, tomatoes, parsley, onions, mint, dill, salt, pepper and mix until all the ingredients are blended. Remove grape leaves from jar and rinse leaves under cold running water. (The leaves should be bright green and if they are too dark, they have been in the jar too long and will be bitter and tough.

Take one grape leaf at a time, with the vein of the leaf on the top, and place 1 tablespoon of the filling in the front center of the leaf. Fold the top part of the leaf over the rice, while folding the sides, rolling it up like an egg roll. Place the stuffed leaves in a 3 inch deep baking pan and repeat the process until all the rice mixture has been used.

Line the stuffed grape leaves close together to prevent unfolding during baking. Cover the top with one layer of plain leaves to prevent the stuffed grape leaves from browning. Pour the water and lemon juice on top and cover tightly with foil. Bake for 3 hours. Serves 8 to 10.

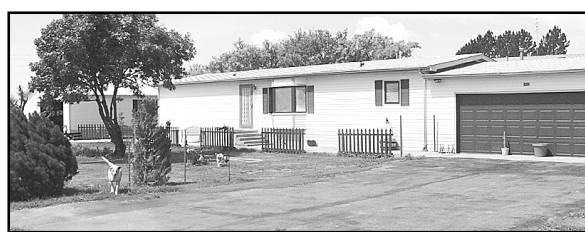
