"We invited nine teams," Coach Smith said. "It is a good meet, and gives us an early indication of where we are."

The next meet will be at 8 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 13 at Wamego. The team travels to Ulysses on Sept. 23 and Oberlin on Sept. 30. They head to Lakin for an invitational at 9 a.m. on Oct. 11. Goodland will host the North-

on Oct. 25, and state cross country will be held on Nov. 1. Looking at the girls, Smith said

he was glad to see the return the four girls from last year, including Kalie Smith from Sharon Springs. She joined senior Charlie Short, coming up every day after school for practice. This year they are joined by Mara Sloan, a freshman. There is no cross country program in Sharon Springs, so the girls will participate with the Goodland team until the regional competition, when they have to run in their own class.

Short is one of the returning girls Smith is looking to for improvement and leadership. The other returning letter winners are Tiffany Thomas and Chelsea Ontiveroz, sophomores, who should show continued improvement. Thomas has been running quite a bit over the summer, and was the fastest of the girls at the Soap Scrimmage demonstration run on Thursday.

Looking ahead to the season, Smith said he believes with the returning lettermen, the boys will be competitive.

'We are hurt by the numbers because we have such a small team," he said. "We have to stay healthy and away from injuries."

The coach said it takes seven varsity runners to compete as a team in a meet, and with nine on the boys, there is not much margin. On the girls' side, where there are only six, he said, they will be short at every meet and at the end of the season because they will lose the three girls from Sharon Springs in regional

The Goodland girls will have to run independently if they qualify for the regional or state cross country meets.


