State commission sets discipline hearing for judge

The state Commission on Judicial Qualifications has set a judicial discipline hearing for Cheyenne County District Magistrate Judge Tamara Zimbelman for Thursday and Friday, Nov. 20 and 21.

The hearing will be begin at 9 a.m. each day at the Kansas Judicial Center, 301 W. 10th, in Topeka. A seven-member panel of the 14-member commission will take evidence and hear arguments.

Ron Keefover, education-information officer for the Kansas Judicial Department, said that at the conclusion, the commission will take the matter under advisement.

If a violation of the Canons of Judicial Conduct is found, the commission will make recommendations for discipline to the Supreme Court.

Edward G. Collister Jr., examiner for the commission, reported last month that formal proceedings had been issued against Judge Zimbelman. In her answer, she denied that her conduct violated the canons.

Nine counts were filed against Judge Zimbelman, all alleging violations of Canons 1 and 2 rules of the Supreme Court. In all nine counts, Judge Zimbelman denied engaging in conduct which violated the rules.
