The Goodland Star-News Two Cowboy runners won medals Thursday in the season opening cross country meet at Sugar Hills Country Club.

Senior Speedy Aguilar defended his title as the senior boys winner, taking the three-mile run in 18.06. There were 42 runners, but Aguilar led the race from beginning to end.

About halfway through the race, three other runners kept close behind Aguilar, but after climbing one of the hills on the golf course, the runners turned and headed down hill.

Aguilar began to stretch his lead, and when he finished, the closest runner, Zane Peterson of Ogallala, Neb., was 30 seconds behind.

Aguilar's time was 25 seconds faster than he had run the race the year before.

"I was glad Aguilar had a chance to defend his title," said Coach Don Smith. "He ran a very good race, and when they hit that hill, he just pulled away. He has such a fluid way of running. He is very smooth, and it never looks like he is getting tired."

Other Cowboys in the junior/senior race were Daniel Blake, 14th. 20.19; James Cearley, 26th, 21.30; and Craig Mason, 32nd, 22.22

Freshman Kerek Mason was the other Cowboy to take a medal, fin-
