

Golf team wins home tourney

The Cowgirl varsity golf team won its second straight event Tuesday, taking the Goodland Invitational Girls Golf Tournament at the Sugar Hills golf course by 10 strokes.

The Cowgirls' team score of 199 beat second-place Syracuse High. Varsity competition was played on the par-35 front nine.
Goodland senior Jessica Osborn finished second, shooting a six-over-par 41. Senior Kayla Rasure finished third with 45. Juniors Bailee Guyer (55) and Amy Cebula (58) also snared medals, coming in eighth and tenth respectively.
"I thought the team played very well," Coach Connie Livengood said. "Jessica shot very well. The other highlight of the day was Kayla shooting a 45. She had an outstanding day."
Syracuse's Maggie Welch was the tournament champion with a score of 38.

Freshman Brooke Whitmore was first in the junior varsity competition, played on the par-36 back nine. She shot a 51. Other medalists for Goodland were freshman Hannah Burkett (60) third, junior Ana McClung (61) fourth, sophomore Kelsey Leiker (64) fifth, and junior Emily Burkett (66) seventh.
"Brooke played extremely well and she will go as a varsity player next week," Livengood said. "Ana shot well for her first tournament (back from surgery)."
The team heads for Hays on

Cowgirl tennis team busy early

The Goodland Cowgirls tennis team earned three medals and tied for third at the Colby Invitational Saturday.
The girls also earned medals at meets in Phillipsburg last Tuesday, Sept. 2, and Larned last Thursday, Sept. 4, but lost a player to injury in Phillipsburg.

The junior varsity team had an undefeated doubles team at Scott City last Thursday.
In Colby, the Goodland No. 1 doubles team took second place, the No. 2 singles player earned third and the No. 2 doubles team was fourth.
Jennifer Mentzer and Megan McCall were 4-1 in No. 1 doubles, beating teams from Colby, Ulysses, Garden City and Tribune. They lost a close match 6-4 to Phillipsburg in the finals.
Jillian Parker, a freshman, finished 3-2 in No. 2 singles, beating players from Tribune, Ness City and Garden City. She lost to Liberal and Garden City but later beat the same girl from Garden City for the third-place medal.
Trista Lalicker and Jena McCall finished 2-3 in No. 2 doubles and won the fourth place medal.
In No. 1 singles, May Davis finished with a 1-4 record and got sev-

enth place competing against more experienced players.
Goodland tied for third with 22 points.
In Larned, the Cowgirls went up against stiff competition and had to use a less experienced No. 1 singles player due to the injury to Shannon Showalter at Phillipsburg.
Nonetheless, the Cowgirls did well, Coach Wallace Hansen said.
Mentzer and Megan McCall were 2-2 in No. 1 doubles. They beat Cox/Hall of Pratt 8-1 and Spare/Callahan of Larned 9-8 (7-5) but lost to Koester/Schiller of Hoisington 9-8 (7-4) and Ost/Davidson of Great Bend 8-1.
Lalicker and Grace Langness were 0-4 as the No. 2 doubles team. They lost to Sandborn/Roberts of Pratt 8-3, to Young/McWhirter of Great Bend 8-0, to Littrell/J. Koester of Hoisington 8-3 and to Nech/Schmidt of Larned 8-2.
Parker finished 1-3. She faced Anita Sueka of Great Bend, an exchange student from Czechoslova-

kia, and lost 8-1. Her victory was in a match with Crotinger of Hoisington, which she won 8-1.
In No. 1 singles, Davis was 0-4 filling in for Showalter, Hansen said, but she improved a great deal from start to finish.
Goodland tied for fourth with Pratt with 8 points. Great Bend was first with 29.
On the same day, the junior varsity team went to Scott City. Kali Rietcheck and Megan Stefan were undefeated in No. 1 doubles at 4-0. They beat Colby 6-3, Garden City 6-4 and a composite team 6-0, then beat the host Scott City in the medals playoff 7-5.
In No. 2 doubles, Sandy Johnson and Jena McCall were 3-1, beating teams from Colby, Garden City and an independent team. They lost to Scott City in a tie break 5-7.
Jessica Lu and Kristen Lammers represented Goodland in singles matches.
At Phillipsburg, Goodland's No. 1 doubles team of Mentzer and Megan McCall finished second with a 3-1 record. The No. 2 doubles team of Lalicker and Langness finished third with a 2-2 record.
In singles play, Parker finished 0-3 against tough competition. Showalter lost her first match in No. 1 singles 6-8 and then withdrew from the meet due to the injury.
