

## Livestock show begins today

Six area youths will compete this weekend at the 71st annual Kansas Junior Livestock Show in Wichita.

Jace and John Mosbarger of Goodland will show market steers, Chance and Clay Schilling of Edson will show Limousin breeding heifers, and Garrett and Ryan Taylor Goodland, will show market barrows. The show is from today through Monday.

Youths from 88 Kansas counties will compete at the show, in all, 670 exhibitors bringing 1,369 head of livestock. There will be 131 market steers, 288 breeding heifers, 352 market hogs, 348 market lambs, 48 breeding ewes and 202 wether rams.

The top five animals from each of the market divisions — steers, hogs, lambs — will sell during the event's Auction of Champions at 6 p.m. Monday. The show will present a minimum of \$12,000 in scholarships to exhibitors.

Since the program began in 1993, \$121,250 in scholarships have been presented to exhibitors who have excelled in school, community service, 4-H and Future Farmers of America.

Contributions and income generated from the Beefeater Barbecue prior to the auction pay for the scholarship program. Tickets to the barbecue can be purchased at the door or by calling 316-268-1151.

Separate from the selection of specie champions, a showmanship contest will be held for exhibitors of cattle, sheep and swine. The top showman in the junior and senior divisions will receive a silver belt buckle. Prizes will also be awarded for second through fifth place in each division.

The association's calf show and sale will be Saturday. More than 60 head of prospect steers and heifers will sell, and part of the proceeds will pay for scholarships and educational activities.

# Men planned to buy drug store

**September 19, 1903:** Ennis to Sell Drug Store — Dr. Moore and T.A. Stevenson of Oneida have been negotiating for the purchase of the Ennis drug store. An inventory of stock was taken this week, and the deal will be in probability closed by Saturday.

Messrs. Moore and Stevenson are bright young men, and will no doubt make a success of the business. Mr. Moore is a registered pharmacist and a competent druggist.

Mr. Ennis is an old-timer, having commenced in business in Eustis early in 1886. He will probably remain here and make permanent investments in the town and county. His old neighbors and friends wish him success.

## today in history

By Lightning — Three Houses on Dewey Lands in Cheyenne County Burned Down — Three frame, two story houses on land belonging to the Dewey Cattle company were struck by lightning September 5 and burned to the ground.

The houses were unoccupied and were known as the Tilberry house near Bird City, the Schrader house near Grace post office, and the third one was a house on West End ranch, the exact building could not be learned.

Anelectrical storm, accompanied by rain passed over the south part of Cheyenne county that day, and the cause of the fires is attributed to the work of lightning.

**September 21, 1903:** Three men were arrested and lodged in the jail here for breaking into a freight car. The car contained ten casks and barrels of whiskey and boxes containing full bottles and glassware. The cargo was consigned from Savannah, Ga., to Denver. The men had opened one of the boxes containing fancy bar bottles.

**September 22, 1903:** Forty-Five Men Walk Out — Helpers and other Men at Shops Demand More Pay — Forty-five men, consisting of boiler washers, boilermakers' helpers, machinist helpers, blacksmith helpers, wipers, hostler helpers and other classes of laborers, walked out the railroad shops Saturday morning at

nine o'clock because of the failure of the Rock Island company to allow them the raise in wages which they demanded about two weeks ago.

The action of the strikers en masse almost completely stopped work, and the necessary work of getting out engines, etc. was performed with difficulty. The strikers held several meetings to consider matters, and Sunday the company opened up negotiations with them. Telegrams were received and finally an amicable settlement was agreed upon, and the men returned to work Monday.
