Men planned to buy drug store

By Lightning — Three Houses on Dewey Lands in Cheyenne County Burned Down — Three frame, two story houses on land belonging to the Dewey Cattle company were struck by lightning September 5 and burned to the ground.

The houses were unoccupied and were known as the Tilberry house near Bird City, the Schrader house near Grace post office, and the third one was a house on West End ranch, the exact building could not be learned.

An electrical storm, accompanied by rain passed over the south part of work of lightning.

September 21, 1903: Three men were arrested and lodged in the jail here for breaking into a freight car. The car contained ten casks and barrels of whiskey and boxes containing full bottles and glassware. The cargo was consigned from Savannah, Ga., to Denver. The men had opened one of the boxes containing fancy bar bottles.

The action of the strikers en masse almost completely stopped work, and the necessary work of getting out engines, etc. was performed with difficulty. The strikers held several meetings to consider matters, and Sunday the company opened up negotiations with them. Telegrams were received and finally an amicable settlement was agreed upon, and the men returned to work Monday.
