Goodland tennis team places second at home

The Goodland Cowgirls tennis team finished second at home Tuesday among five teams in the annual varsity invitational.

Colby was first with 30 points, Goodland second with 20, and Scott City third with 19. Tribune had 17 points and Garden City 14.

In No. 1 singles, Katie Lang of Colby won the gold medal. Goodland's Grace Langness was 0-4, Coach Wallace Hansen said, but she played well in stretches and had several close matches.

Goodland's Megan McCall and Jennifer Mentzer won the gold in No. 1 doubles. They beat Stone/Edmonds of Tribune 6-0, Lang/Mannebach of Colby 6-2, Thieman/VanCampen of Scott City 6-2 and Williams/Hands of Garden City 6-0.

Jillian Parker of Goodland finished with a 2-2 record and won the bronze medal in No. 2 singles. She beat Hoffman of Garden City 6-2 and Appel of Scott City by default and lost to Govert of Tribune 6-3 and Funk of Colby 6-3. Funk was 4-0 to take the gold medal.

In No. 2 doubles, Trista Lalicker and Jena McCall of Goodland went 2-2 for the bronze. They beat Christmas/Huschka of Garden City 6-2 and Howard/Miller of Tribune 6-4. They lost to Woodall/Herschberger of Colby 6-2 and the champions, Hess/Boulware of Scott City 6-3. This is about mid-season, Hansen said; from now on the Cowgirls will be trying to peak for regionals. The coach said several girls were feeling under the weather Tuesday due to colds and were suffering in the 90-degree heat.

The only Cowgirl who was unable to play, he said, was Shannon Showalter, who has been out with a bone bruise. Whether or not she will play is uncertain, he said, since one doctor has said it is not a good idea and another said she could play if the pain is not too bad.

The Goodland High varsity volleyball team improved its record to 8-2 by sweeping three matches Tuesday evening at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowgirls' first victims were the Indians of Leoti High School, who went down 25-6 and 25-15.

The next two opponents were more difficult, both requiring a third game. Goodland lost its first game 21-25 against the Lady Broncs of Lakin High, then fought back to win the second 25-20. The Cowgirls maintained their momentum and won the third game 15-10.

Goodland's final match featured the two remaining unbeaten teams of the meet. The Lady Beavers of Scott City had already defeated Lakin and Leoti earlier in the evening. The Cowgirls took the first game 25-15 but the Beavers came back to take the second 25-13. The Cowgirls then stepped up to the challenge and won the third game 15-9.

Coach Jerry McKee said that the team made adjustments as the night progressed to make things work. The varsity played without senior Kelsey Herl, who was out sick. Sophomore Justeen Koehler and freshman Whitney Archer combined to help fill the void.

"Whitney and Justeen did a great



job filling in for Kelsey," McKee said. All three of the Goodland junior varsity's matches went to three games. The girls defeated Leoti 2-1 and lost to both Lakin and Scott City 2-1. The Cowgirl 'C' team split its matches, losing to Lakin 2-1 and beating Leoti 2-0.

The next action for the varsity will be Thursday, Sept. 25, for a triangular meet with Holcomb and

Ulysses.
