

Unbeaten, ranked teams meet Cowboys vs. Buffaloes tonight

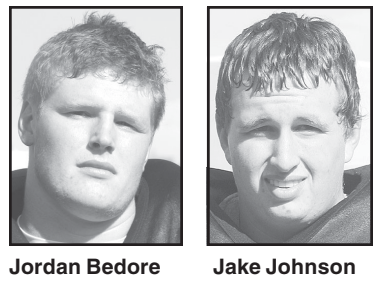
Two undefeated football teams will take the field at 6:30 tonight at Cowboy Stadium when the Goodland Cowboys host the Atwood Buffaloes.

The Cowboys started their season with three victories, the latest a 39-0 thumping of the St. Francis Indians last Friday. Goodland is up two spots in this week's Salina Journal State Rankings to No. 7 for Class 4A.

The Buffaloes are 3-0 for the season after defeating Quinter 37-14 last Friday. Atwood remains No. 2 this week in the rankings for Class 2-1A.

Cowboy head coach, Tony Diehl, said Atwood is a quality team with a great coach. He said Goodland is ready and is looking forward to playing another great team for the second week in a row.

Despite the loss, St. Francis is ranked No. 10 this week for Class

"Coach (Dan) Lanka always has his players ready to play," Diehl said.
Diehl said the Buffaloes' strength is in their defense and that offensively they also have a good running attack. One of their best assets, he added, was they have a winning tradition.
Diehl said that Atwood has won at least the last three meetings in a row.
Offensively, the Cowboy rushing attack is led by senior running back Jordan Bedore with 468 yards on 72 carries and five touchdowns. Soph-

omore running back Bobby Miller has 276 yards on 37 carries and four touchdowns.
Senior quarterback Jared Doke has completed 12 of 21 passes for 193 yards with one touchdown and an interception. He has run for 158 yards on 31 carries and scored three touchdowns.
Diehl said junior center Jake Johnson is really doing well, knows the blocking schemes and has been able to handle most nose guards by himself.
Bedore, in his defensive role as linebacker, leads the team in tackles with 45 including two sacks. He also has one fumble recovery.
As a team the Cowboys are averaging more than 33 points per game and limiting their opponents to 12 per game. On the ground they are out-rushing them 337 yards to 191.
Goodland is converting 67 percent of its third-down attempts while only allowing other team to convert 11 percent.


