The Cowboys started their season with three victories, the latest a 39-0 thumping of the St. Francis Indians last Friday. Goodland is up two spots in this week's Salina Journal State Rankings to No. 7 for Class 4A.

The Buffaloes are 3-0 for the season after defeating Quinter 37-14 last Friday. Atwood remains No. 2 this week in the rankings for Class 2-1A.

Cowboy head coach, Tony Diehl, said Atwood is a quality team with a great coach. He said Goodland is ready and is looking forward to playing another great team for the second week in a row.
